



**Keeneland | Race 11 | Saturday, April 04, 2026 | Dirt 1 1/8 Miles | Fast**

**Purse \$1,300,000 | Grade 1 — Blue Grass Stakes | 9-Horse Field | Post: 6:22 PM ET**

## SECTION 1 — PACE ANALYSIS

### True Front Runners

**REAGAN'S HONOR (#4)** — The model projects Reagan's Honor as the field's primary pace source by a significant margin. His Q1 of 40.18 MPH leads the field — his Fair Grounds allowance win on Feb 19 was a front-running demolition job under hand ride, drawing off by a wide margin with a Beyer of 101. That figure is the highest in this field by a meaningful gap. DeVaux keeps him in front from the start, Ortiz J.L. (27% win rate, 294 starts in 2026) is the top jockey assignment in the race. The analytical tension is that 1 1/8 miles is untested territory for this horse, and his VULNERABLE SSR (-14.9%) at the target distance projects a steep late fade under pace pressure.

**FURTHER ADO (#6)** — The 8-5 favorite projects as a co-pace participant with a 38.96 Q1 — tied with Talkin for second in the field. His Keeneland maiden win at this distance produced a 98 Beyer in a dominant performance; his Tampa Derby second came from a duel that ended with him being caught late. Cox's 2Off45-180 angle (28%) and the Irad Ortiz assignment (25% win rate) are the most decorated connections in the race. STRONG SSR (-7.6%).

**TALKIN (#1)** — Projects with a 38.96 Q1 from his Tampa Derby tracking trip. He sat 2-wide through the pace in both the Tampa Derby and Champagne G2, suggesting a pressing rather than pure front-running profile. VULNERABLE SSR (-10.0%) at 1 1/8 miles.

### Stalkers / Pressers

**CLASS PRESIDENT (#2)** — Pletcher's Rebel G2 winner projects as the field's primary mid-pack presser. His 38.79 Q1 and STRONG SSR (-7.2%) at 1 1/8 miles are the model's best sustained speed figures among the established graded winners. His Rebel win showed him pressing from 2nd before being headed late and gamely fighting back — a profile that at 1 1/8 miles with an honest pace plays directly to his strengths. Pletcher has won this race four times; the J/T at Keeneland (15 starts, 33%, \$2.05 ROI) is extraordinary.

**MOONSTROCITY (#8)** — Projects in the pace mix off a 38.63 Q1 from his GP dirt route effort, where he duelled on the lead before fading. The model flags him as a pace participant who projects VULNERABLE at 1 1/8 miles (-13.7%). Antonucci's trainer stats are modest. Primarily a pace contributor.

**OCELLI (#7)** — Also entered in the Wood Memorial. Projects with a 38.14 Q1 in a mid-pack stalking role. VULNERABLE SSR (-11.5%). Beckman's GrdStk stat (27 starts, 4%) is the weakest in the field. The Closer Look notes he's still a maiden against stakes winners — a significant class gap.

### Closers

**CREOLE CHROME (#5)** — The model's standout analytical finding in this race. His ELITE SSR (-1.1%) at 1 1/8 miles is derived from his Louisiana Stakes wire victory at Fair Grounds, where his late velocity barely declined from his opening fraction. Sharp's 31-60 day angle (19%, \$1.48 ROI) and WonLastStart (25%) are solid. All four starts have been against Louisiana state-bred company — the class question is real and significant. Gaffalione at 16% win rate takes over.

**GREAT WHITE (#3)** — Three Chimneys/Ennis entry projects from a stalking position with an ELITE SSR (-3.2%) derived from synthetic Turfway form. His J. Battaglia Mem win at Turfway





produced his best figure. The surface switch from synthetic to Keeneland fast dirt is the primary uncertainty. Achard retains.

**OTTINHO (#9)** — Also entered in the Wood Memorial at Aqueduct. Prat takes over from Davis — the jockey upgrade is the headline. Brown's 1stBlink angle (25%) is active. ELITE SSR (-3.6%) at 1 1/8 miles from Aqueduct route form. The Blue Grass is his second Grade 1 opportunity and Brown's third attempt to win this race.

### Pace Scenario Projection

The model projects a MODERATE to HONEST early pace. Reagan's Honor's 40.18 Q1 will establish a clear early lead; Further Ado and Talkin both project with 38.96 Q1 figures and will press from the second and third positions. The projected half-mile is in the :46.5-:47.0 range on Keeneland fast dirt — an HONEST pace for Grade 1 company. The structural beneficiaries are horses with sustained closing velocity from mid-pack positions. The model identifies FURTHER ADO (#6) and CLASS PRESIDENT (#2) — both with STRONG SSR profiles — as the primary beneficiaries, along with CREOLE CHROME (#5) whose ELITE SSR (-1.1%) is the most significant single figure in this race. Reagan's Honor (#4) generates the pace that the model projects will collapse in the final quarter mile, creating the setup for the sustained closers. The key variable is whether Reagan's Honor's dominant FG form translates to Grade 1 pressure — if he gets an uncontested lead, the VULNERABLE SSR is less meaningful than if Further Ado and Talkin challenge him through the first half.

## SECTION 3 — CONTENDER ANALYSIS

### #6 Further Ado ★★★★★

#### Strengths:

- Career-defining 98 Beyer at Keeneland on this surface in his maiden win — that figure is exceptional and produced at the specific track and distance of today's race. The Closer Look's observation that 'maybe he's a different horse on this track' is the model's central thesis for this selection.





- Cox's 2Off45-180 angle (196 starts, 28%, \$1.81 ROI) and GrdStk angle (166 starts, 21%, \$1.82 ROI) are the strongest trainer production figures for a primary contender in this race. Irad Ortiz (25% win rate) retains and has ridden this horse in every meaningful start.
- STRONG SSR (-7.6%) at the correct 1 1/8-mile distance. His Tampa Derby second required him to duel through honest fractions while bumped — the model treats that as a limited-run performance with sustainable late velocity.
- Gun Runner x Sky Dreamer (Sky Mesa) — the Closer Look notes kinship to G2/G3 Dubai winner Kimbear. The pedigree supports the 1 1/8-mile Blue Grass distance.

**Concerns:**

- 8-5 morning line implies 38.5% win probability. The model projects 30% — a meaningful negative deviation. At 8-5 in a 9-horse Grade 1 field, the model rates Further Ado at FAIR rather than VALUE. The market has priced his Keeneland maiden accurately but may be extrapolating too heavily from that one dominant performance.
- The Kentucky Juvenile Championship win (CD Nov25) and Tampa Derby 2nd are his two subsequent efforts after the Kee maiden — neither was 'electric' per the Closer Look. The model watches whether his Grade 1 step-up produces the Kee-specific version of Further Ado or the more ordinary Tampa version.

**Race Shape Fit:** Good. The projected honest pace from Reagan's Honor and Talkin positions Further Ado optimally for a mid-race bid from 3rd or 4th. His Cox trainer angle is specifically suited to horses making their first Grade 1 start off a layoff — the 2Off45-180 stat (28%) is directly applicable.

**Projection:** Model's top selection at FAIR value. The 8-5 ML is appropriately priced — not a VALUE overlay, but the Keeneland-specific form, Cox's return angle, and STRONG SSR project him as the most probable winner. The model recommends him as the A horse in multi-race sequences and a defensible win bet at current morning line odds.

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**#2 Class President ★★★★★**

**Strengths:**

- STRONG SSR (-7.2%) — the best sustained speed profile among horses with confirmed graded stakes dirt route form. His Rebel G2 win required him to press from 2nd for the full nine furlongs, be headed at the stretch call, and fight back gamely. That is the precisely the closing pattern at 1 1/8 miles that the model rewards.
- Pletcher has won the Blue Grass four times — the most of any trainer in this race's history. His J/T with Velazquez at Keeneland (15 starts, 33%, \$2.05 ROI) is the single most productive trainer-jockey combination at this track in this field. WonLastStart angle (151 starts, 30%, \$1.99 ROI) is active.
- Uncle Mo x Top Quality (Quality Road) — the breeding profile suggests tactical speed that sustains at route distances. His Beyer figures (78-87-91) are trending upward at exactly the right time.

**Concerns:**

- His only two-turn start was the Rebel — one race of route experience entering a Grade 1. The Rebel field at Oaklawn was not as deep as the Blue Grass field, and the class step is material.
- At 7-2, the model's 22% projection matches the 22.2% implied — a precise FAIR valuation. The model does not see a significant overlay opportunity at this price, though





the STRONG SSR and Pletcher/Velazquez angle push the qualitative case toward the borderline of VALUE.

**Race Shape Fit:** Excellent. The Rebel profile — pressed from 2nd, headed, fought back — is directly analogous to how a Blue Grass plays out from an honest early pace. Class President is the horse whose tactical profile most precisely matches the race shape the model projects.

**Projection:** Model's second choice. At 7-2, this is the most structurally supported horse in the field relative to his price. The Pletcher/Velazquez/Keeneland combination and a STRONG SSR from confirmed two-turn form make him the model's preferred multi-race partner with Further Ado.

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#### #4 Reagan's Honor ★★★

##### **Strengths:**

- Career Beyer of 101 from his FG allowance win — the highest figure in this field. His Q1 projection of 40.18 MPH is the field's dominant opening velocity. DeVaux's WonLastStart angle (78 starts, 18%) and the Ortiz J.L. assignment (27%) combine for the strongest jockey-trainer pairing on a pace horse in the race.
- The FG route win over older horses is the Closer Look's headline — the model acknowledges that beating elders in an allowance race at 1 1/8 miles is a meaningful class credential for a 3-year-old in February.

##### **Concerns:**

- VULNERABLE SSR (-14.9%) — the steepest deceleration projection in the field. His two route wins both came with clear, uncontested leads at Fair Grounds against non-graded competition. At Keeneland in a Grade 1 with Further Ado, Talkin, and Class President pressing from the 2nd and 3rd positions, an uncontested lead is not the projected scenario.
- No stakes experience, no Keeneland experience, first Grade 1 start. The 5-2 ML implies 28.6% win probability for a horse whose best performance came against older allowance horses in February. The model projects 18% — a MARGINAL negative that grows if the pace scenario is contested.

**Race Shape Fit:** Dependent on pace scenario. If Reagan's Honor gets an uncontested lead through the first half, his raw speed could produce a wire-to-wire effort that the field can't catch. If Further Ado challenges him through the first turn, the VULNERABLE decel profile projects a late collapse.

**Projection:** Third choice at MARGINAL value. The model cannot dismiss a 101 Beyer in a Grade 1 field, but the class jump, track switch, and VULNERABLE SSR under contested conditions are structural concerns that make the 5-2 price an insufficient overlay to recommend as a win bet over Further Ado or Class President.

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#### #5 Creole Chrome ★★★

##### **Strengths:**

- ELITE SSR (-1.1%) — the best sustained speed rating in the field. Creole Chrome's Louisiana Stakes win showed minimal velocity degradation through the final quarter mile of a 1 1/16-mile route. At the correct 1 1/8-mile distance, this ELITE profile projects him





maintaining his velocity through the extended final run better than any other horse in this race.

- Won three of four with the only blemish being a third in the Louisiana Juvenile B against state-bred company. Sharp's 31-60 day (19%) and WonLastStart (25%) are active. Gaffalione (16% win rate) is a meaningful upgrade in jockey quality.

**Concerns:**

- All four starts vs. Louisiana state-bred competition at Fair Grounds — the class jump to Grade 1 against nationally-campaigned horses is the largest in the field. The Closer Look notes 'the water is quite a bit deeper here' and that 'the guy to his left' (Reagan's Honor) could set the tempo — which at 8-1 is an intriguing proposition if pace collapses.
- First Keeneland start; Volatile x Funny Moon (Malibu Moon) — the sire Volatile is relatively unproven in graded stakes. The model acknowledges substantial uncertainty about whether his ELITE SSR from state-bred company translates to Grade 1 pressure.

**Race Shape Fit:** Good. The projected honest early pace from Reagan's Honor could produce exactly the scenario where Creole Chrome's ELITE late velocity — if it translates to this company — runs down tiring pace horses in the stretch. The 8-1 price builds in significant uncertainty about the class question.

**Projection:** Fourth choice and VALUE overlay at 8-1. The model projects 12% against 11.1% implied — a clear VALUE position driven by ELITE SSR that no other horse in the field can match from the data. The class question is the limiting factor; it prevents a higher ranking but the model includes him as a primary B/C horse in multi-race sequences at a price that compensates for the uncertainty.

**#3 Great White ★★★**

**Strengths:**

- ELITE SSR (-3.2%) from his J. Battaglia Mem win at Turfway — showed genuine sustained velocity through the final segment of a 1 1/8-mile route. Ennis's GrdStk angle (5 starts, 20%, \$6.11 ROI) — small sample but productive. Strong Keeneland work (4f :47.3B on Mar 29) on the correct surface.

**Concerns:**

- Every career start has been on synthetic at Turfway. Fast dirt at Keeneland is a complete surface switch with zero confirmatory data. The Closer Look acknowledges 'you never really know how they'll handle it until they handle it.' The model cannot project Grade 1 synthetic form to fast dirt with confidence.

**Race Shape Fit:** Unknown until the surface question is answered. If Great White handles fast Keeneland dirt, his ELITE SSR and J. Battaglia form project him as a legitimate late-running threat. If the surface is an issue, no amount of analytical profile can overcome it.

**Projection:** Fifth choice and VALUE overlay at 15-1. Model projects 8% against 6.3% implied. The VALUE overlay is driven by the ELITE SSR at a compelling price, with the synthetic-to-dirt surface switch as the reason for the wide market odds. Recommended as a C horse in multi-race tickets — in a 9-horse Grade 1, the closing profile at 15-1 justifies exotics inclusion.

**#9 Ottinho ★★**

**Strengths:**



- Brown adds blinkers (1stBlink: 51 starts, 25%, \$2.46 ROI) and upgrades to Prat (30% win rate) — the jockey is the best in the field by a significant margin. Brown has won the Blue Grass three times. ELITE SSR (-3.6%). The Closer Look notes Brown 'doesn't win at a high percentage because he puts his horses in the wrong spots so if he shipped this guy you should probably take notice.'

**Concerns:**

- His best form came on a sloppy Aqueduct track in a maiden; the Withers third was in soft fractions that didn't suit him. First Keeneland start. The model projects 6% win probability against 4.8% implied — a VALUE overlay but a narrow one.

**Race Shape Fit:** Speculative but structurally sound. The Brown/Prat/blinkers combination in a Grade 1 with an honest pace projection is the model's definition of a live longshot. ELITE SSR means he sustains velocity if the trip sets up.

**Projection:** Sixth choice and VALUE at 20-1. Model projects 6% against 4.8% implied. Recommended as a C or D horse in multi-race wagers — the Brown/Prat combination and ELITE SSR at 20-1 represent the type of price overlay the model specifically identifies for exotic ticket construction in Grade 1 fields.

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**#1 Talkin — TOSS**

**Projection:** The model TOSSES Talkin as a win investment. His longest two starts — the Remsen G2 and Tampa Derby — produced his two worst efforts, validating the Closer Look's observation that 'his 2 longest races resulted in his 2 poorest efforts.' VULNERABLE SSR (-10.0%) at 1 1/8 miles is the model's analytical confirmation of that pattern. At 10-1, the implied 9.1% is above the model's 3% projection — MARGINAL value at best. Good Magic x Rote (Tiznow) provides stamina pedigree, but the form says the distance has been a problem. Include only in very wide exotic coverage.

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**#7 Ocelli — TOSS**

**Projection:** The model TOSSES Ocelli. Maiden vs. stakes winners; VULNERABLE SSR (-11.5%); Beckman's GrdStk stat (4%) is the weakest in the field. The VA Derby showed him fading at the target distance. He is also entered in the Wood Memorial at Aqueduct — the split entry itself signals connections are uncertain about placement. NEGATIVE at 30-1.

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**#8 Moonstocity — TOSS**

**Projection:** The model TOSSES Moonstocity. Two starts, one dirt route (3rd in a maiden), VULNERABLE SSR (-13.7%) in the worst deceleration projection in the field. His turf start was off the board. Antonucci's GrdStk record (7 starts, 0 wins) and modest 2026 stats (6%) produce the field's weakest trainer profile. The bullet work (5f 1:00B on Mar 27) is the lone positive; it is insufficient to overcome the analytical picture. NEGATIVE at 30-1.

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**SECTION 4 — MPH ANALYSIS + SUSTAINED SPEED RATINGS**

### Critical MPH Insight

The defining analytical finding in this race is the complete inversion of Reagan's Honor's statistical dominance when moving from Q1 to Q4. Reagan's Honor's 40.18 Q1 — the dominant opening velocity in the field by a 1.22 MPH margin — is the single most impressive early pace figure on this card. His **VULNERABLE** deceleration of -14.9%, however, projects the steepest late-velocity collapse in the field. This inversion — dominant early, projected to fade decisively — is the model's central analytical output for the Blue Grass. The question the model poses is not whether Reagan's Honor will try to wire this field; he will. The question is whether Further Ado, Class President, and Creole Chrome can run him down in the final quarter mile. Creole Chrome's **ELITE** SSR of -1.1% is the most striking closing profile in the race — minimal velocity degradation at 1 1/8 miles. If his Louisiana state-bred form translates to Grade 1 Keeneland pressure, the model projects him arriving with more remaining velocity in the final eighth mile than any other horse in this field.

## SECTION 5 — IMPROVEMENT & REGRESSION CANDIDATES





### Likely to Improve

**FURTHER ADO (#6)** — The model projects Forward movement from the Tampa Derby. That effort was his first two-turn start outside of Keeneland — he dueled through honest fractions while bumped at 3/16 and was caught at the wire. The model treats the Tampa Derby as an effort that expended more energy than a clean trip at Keeneland would require. Returning to the track where he posted a career-best 98 Beyer with Cox's 2Off45-180 angle active, the model projects a figure approaching or exceeding that performance.

**CLASS PRESIDENT (#2)** — The Rebel G2 win was his first two-turn start. The model projects improvement from the natural maturation of a horse making his second Grade 2 start in his first Grade 1, with Pletcher at Keeneland (33% J/T) as the directional anchor. His Beyer trend (78-87-91) shows consistent improvement at exactly the rate the model projects continuing.

### Bounce / Regression Risks

**REAGAN'S HONOR (#4)** — The model projects Reagan's Honor as the primary regression risk relative to his market position. His 5-2 ML implies he should be competitive with Further Ado (8-5) and Class President (7-2) — a proximity that the model's analysis does not support. The FG allowance win over older horses was impressive but came in an uncontested front-running scenario against non-graded company. Today's contested pace projection is the directionally opposite scenario. At Grade 1 pressure, the VULNERABLE SSR (-14.9%) is not a ceiling issue; it is the model's projection of what happens when a horse with this deceleration pattern meets the honest early fractions this field projects to generate.

**TALKIN (#1)** — The two-race pattern of declining performance at longer distances (Remsen, Tampa Derby) represents the model's secondary regression candidate. At 10-1, he is priced as a legitimate contender the model does not rate as such based on distance form. The Closer Look's observation about his longest starts being his poorest efforts is the model's analytical foundation — and today is his longest race.

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## SECTION 6 — SUGGESTED BETS

### Win Bet: #6 Further Ado Confidence: 7.5/10

The model projects 30% win probability against 38.5% implied at 8-5 — technically FAIR rather than VALUE, but the Keeneland-specific career-best form, Cox's 28% 2Off45-180 return angle, and STRONG SSR at the correct distance make him the most structurally supported winner in the field. At 8-5, the model recommends Further Ado as the primary win bet not because he is a significant overlay, but because his profile — STRONG SSR, proven Keeneland form, elite connections — is the most analytically complete in the race. If Further Ado drifts to 2-1 or beyond at the windows, the value case strengthens materially.

### Value Play: #5 Creole Chrome Confidence: 7/10

The model projects 12% win probability against 11.1% implied at 8-1 — VALUE overlay anchored by the field's best ELITE SSR (-1.1%). Creole Chrome's sustained velocity profile at 1 1/8 miles is the most analytically compelling finding in the race. The class question from Louisiana state-bred company is fully reflected in the 8-1 price — the model's thesis is that the price compensates for the uncertainty. If the Blue Grass pace develops as projected and Reagan's Honor opens fast, Creole Chrome's ELITE closing velocity projects him arriving with more energy in the stretch than any rival. At 8-1, this is the model's recommended single-bet value play.

**Top 3 Multi-Race: A / B / C A — #6 Further Ado B — #2 Class President C — #5 Creole Chrome Confidence: 7/10**





Further Ado leads the multi-race sequence as the most probable winner on Keeneland-specific form and trainer production. Class President fills the B slot as the STRONG SSR presser with Pletcher/Velazquez at Keeneland (33%). Creole Chrome rounds out as the ELITE SSR VALUE overlay. The model recommends including Otinho (#9) as a D horse in wider tickets — Brown/Prat/blinkers at 20-1 in a Grade 1 is exactly the type of long-priced structural bet the model identifies for exotic ticket construction. The model advises against using Reagan's Honor in top position in multi-race sequences given the VULNERABLE SSR projection and contested pace scenario. Talkin is a throwout in all positions.

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## SECTION 7 — CONFIDENCE RATING

Overall: 7 / 10 ★★★★★★

The model rates the Blue Grass at 7/10 confidence — higher than the Wood Memorial for two reasons. First, the analytical picture is structurally clean: Reagan's Honor's dominant Q1 and VULNERABLE Q4 creates the pace collapse that the STRONG and ELITE SSR horses need. Second, the primary selections (Further Ado, Class President) are both in the STRONG SSR tier with confirmed graded stakes route form at or near the target distance. The primary confidence-limiting factor is the class uncertainty around Creole Chrome — the model's ELITE SSR finding at 8-1 is compelling, but Louisiana state-bred competition is a meaningful class gap from Grade 1 Blue Grass opponents. The secondary uncertainty is whether Reagan's Honor's uncontested-lead profile translates to contested Grade 1 conditions. If Reagan's Honor gets clear and wires the field, the model's analysis will have been correct about the pace scenario but wrong about whether Class President and Further Ado could run him down. The model's recommended emphasis: Further Ado at 8-5 as the win investment, Creole Chrome at 8-1 as the value play, with Class President as the multi-race backbone.
