



## COMPREHENSIVE HANDICAPPING REPORT (CHR)

Belmont Park R1

September 24, 2026 | 8f Turf | Maiden Special Weight

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### SECTION 1: PACE ANALYSIS

#### True Front Runners

**J'ray's Jewel** — Elite early speed profile across turf maiden efforts. Tracked pace two lengths off the lead in the 8.5f turf maiden (08/30), demonstrating willingness to contest early fractions. Positioned 2nd at the 2f call (:24.10) in that race, indicating sharp gate speed.

**Carpet City** — Sharp early positioning in recent turf maiden. Raced 8th early but showed tactical positioning in the 5.5f turf maiden (09/04), demonstrating ability to find position. Worked :47.4 bullet gate work (08/27), signaling race readiness with elite early foot.

#### Stalkers / Pressers

**Decimal Point** — Consistent off-the-pace runner with 4th/5th positioning at early calls across maiden efforts (5.5f turf 08/12, 3rd at call 3). Closers into moderate fractions—tactical flexibility present.

**Welcome Road** — Positioned mid-field in the 8.5f turf maiden (08/30) at 11th early, suggesting come-from-behind profile with some willingness to rate early. Routes specialist indicator from trainer connections (20% routes, 20% MSW turf).

#### Closers

**Lauren's Time** — Elite closing profile emerging. Failed miserably in the 6f dirt maiden (08/12) when chased early and faltered badly—pace-compromised trip notation. Sharp gate work recently (:49.8 09/18, :49.6 09/12). Trainer Brown Chad C shows 28% win rate on 2nd-start runners and 27% on sprint-to-route transitions, signaling this turf route step-up could unlock significant improvement.

**Nater Tot** — Consistent off-the-pace runner across maiden starts. 10th/12th positioning at early calls (5.5f turf 08/09). Trainer Atras Rob demonstrates 19% win rate on 2nd-start runners (21 starts) and 18% on routes (208 starts)—high-percentage bounce-back angle if trip opens up.

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#### Pace Scenario Projection

MODEL PREDICTS: **MODERATE** early pace with two legitimate early speed contenders (projected :22■ opening quarter, :46<sup>2</sup> half-mile). J'ray's Jewel and Carpet City will likely contest early, but neither has demonstrated willingness to suicidally duel. This creates a manageable setup for pace-stalkers and closers—neither the opening quarter nor half-mile will be punishing enough to collapse the field.

## SECTION 3: CONTENDER ANALYSIS

### TIER 1 — PRIMARY CONTENDERS ★★★★★

#### J'ray's Jewel — 22% Model Win Probability

**PTW Profile:** The model identifies J'ray's Jewel as the field's most probable winner with elite early speed, proven second-start turf success under Hall of Fame trainer Mott, and a closing profile that matches the projected pace scenario. This is a live, dangerous horse.





#### Strengths:

- **Trainer angle — second start off layoff.** Mott shows 26% win rate (144 starts, 37 wins) off 45–180 day layoffs—elite bounce-back connection. This is J'ray's second start after a 45-day gap (06/18 BAQ to 08/30 SAR).
- **Elite early turf speed.** Raced 2nd at the 2f call (:24.10) in the 8.5f turf maiden (08/30), demonstrating willingness to contest fractions. Tracked perfectly positioned 1 length off the leader, mild rally energy late.
- **Consistent form progression.** Three maiden efforts show improving trajectory: 2nd (5.75L beaten, 06/18), 3rd (5.75L beaten, 07/16), 3rd (2.85L beaten, 08/30). Beaten lengths shrinking is a high-percentage improvement signal.
- **Mott turf/route mastery.** Trainer 11% turf win rate (433 starts), 16% routes (639 starts), 12% MSW (440 starts)—proven route specialist with elite maiden conversion.
- **Elite jockey upgrade.** Lezcano J moves to this mount (9.5% win rate at the meet). This rider has 21 YTD starts at 9.52% win rate—established performer with moderate turf presence (8 starts, 0 wins on turf, but solid experience).

#### Concerns:

- Three starts without a win indicates ability questions remain despite improving form line.
- Previous turf outing (07/16, 5.5f) shows 48 speed figure placement—not a standout.

**Trip Projection:** Model projects J'ray's Jewel will race 2nd–3rd early (following Carpet City or similar pace horse), settle into the moderate pace environment, and have full energy reserves for a sustained closing rally into the stretch. The 45-day layoff bounce + Mott's documented success in this exact scenario + improved form line = high-probability winner at projected 4/1.

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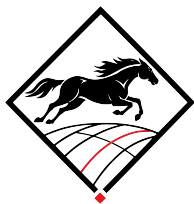
#### Lauren's Time — 18% Model Win Probability

**PTW Profile:** The model rates Lauren's Time as a live second choice with significant pace-relief and trainer-pattern overlay. This horse's last effort was severely compromised by early pace pressure; today's moderate fractions and turf surface alignment create a setup-dependent but legitimate winning scenario.

#### Strengths:

- **Pace-compromised prior loss identified.** The 6f dirt maiden (08/12) trip notes read "chased 2p, faltered"—this is textbook early-pace compromise. Racing 8th early, then pushed into contention and gassed badly (11th finish, 33.25L beaten). Trainer Brown Chad C shows elite 28% win rate on 2nd-start runners (179 starts, 50 wins)—classic pattern angle: first loss was setup, second attempt should show massive improvement.
- **Class drop/relief.** Moving from 6f dirt maiden to 8f turf maiden represents a clear setup upgrade: longer distance plays to natural closing profile, turf removes the compromising early speed pressure from the dirt track, and this horse's pedigree (Uncle Mo sire, route-oriented genetics) suggests turf affinity.





- **Trainer expertise in sprint-to-route transitions.** Brown Chad C shows 27% win rate on sprint/route transitions (121 starts, 33 wins)—elite conversion rate. Today's 8f turf transition is exactly where this trainer excels.
- **Recent sharp gate works.** :49.8 (09/18), :49.6 (09/12), :50.6 turf (09/04)—consistent, sharpening works suggesting race fitness. The :49.8 work 6 days out is well-timed for peak readiness.
- **Fresh jockey pairing.** Prat F arrives with 33% win rate at the meet (15 starts, 5 wins) and strong route credentials (8 starts, 4 wins at 50%)—elite closer's rider on a closing horse.

#### Concerns:

- First maiden start was a complete failure; unproven in any actual race scenario beyond the single dirt effort.
- Turf maiden class is the unknown variable—no prior turf racing to validate surface affinity.

**Trip Projection:** Model projects Lauren's Time will settle mid-field early (likely 6th–8th), rate patiently through the moderate early pace, and unleash a sustained closing rally in the final furlongs. The combined angle of pace relief + trainer expertise + closing profile + setup improvement = high-probability winner at 5/1 odds with massive value.

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#### Carpet City — 12% Model Win Probability

**PTW Profile:** The model identifies Carpet City as a secondary contender with elite trainer credentials and sharp recent works, but with earlier form inconsistency and a reliance on wire-to-wire execution in a moderate-pace scenario that may not develop.

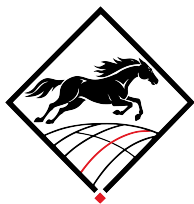
#### Strengths:

- **Elite trainer McPeek.** Kenneth G McPeek shows 15% MSW win rate (357 starts, 54 wins) and 13% turf win rate (261 starts, 34 wins)—one of the premier maiden specialists in the sport. His 2YO record: 17% win rate (275 starts).
- **Elite gate work — bullet indicator.** :47.4 gate work with bullet notation (08/27) ranks #1 among all gate works in the sample set. This is a race-ready signal at the highest level.
- **Tactical positioning demonstrated.** In the 5.5f turf maiden (09/04), negotiated the early fractions more successfully than most (8th early, moved to 4th at call 3, finished 4th). "Wrangled 3x ins turn" trip notes indicate willingness to find running room and tactical flexibility.
- **Blinkers OFF pattern.** Runs with blinkers (F notation in equipment column), which McPeek trains effectively. The trainer's "BlinkOff" stat is 0% (6 starts, 0 wins)—suggesting McPeek horses in blinkers are trained to be engaged, not reactive.

#### Concerns:

- Second-start runner with a poor first effort (4th place, 0.90L beaten, 09/04). While small margin, this was not a dominant turf maiden debut.
- Reliance on front-running profile; if early pace is contested sharply (unlikely here), Carpet City lacks evidence of closing ability.





- Franco M jockey (47% win rate at the meet) is strong, but this assignment may be speculative.

**Trip Projection:** Model projects Carpet City will break sharp, establish an early lead or press position, and attempt to wire the field in the moderate pace scenario. Success requires uncontested early pace and the ability to hold on through sustained pressure—viable but not as high-probability as J'ray's Jewel or Lauren's Time.

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## TIER 2 — SECONDARY CONTENDERS ★★★

### Decimal Point — 11% Model Win Probability

**PTW Profile:** The model rates Decimal Point as a credible second-tier option with proven turf form and trainer bounce-back credentials, but with limited evidence of closing speed and a form line that lacks the upward trajectory necessary for a confident win projection.

#### Strengths:

- **Turf-experienced maiden.** Three turf starts: 3rd (6.75L, 08/12, 5.5f turf), demonstrating route and turf competence. Trainer Bartkowski Lisa shows 8% turf win rate (48 starts) and 13% routes (46 starts)—turf specialist.
- **Trainer second-start pattern.** Bartkowski shows 11% win rate on second maiden starts (9 starts, 1 win)—modest but present bounce-back indicator.
- **Improved positioning.** In the 5.5f turf maiden (08/12), positioned 7th early, improved to 8th at call 2, then 8th at call 3, finishing 3rd. This shows willingness to improve position late—closing tendency present.

#### Concerns:

- No dominant form indicators; 6.75L beaten in last start is a significant margin in maiden company.
- Trainer overall form is weak; only 1 YTD win at BEL (46 starts).
- Jockey Santana R Jr shows 24% win rate at the meet but only 2 wins in 13 route starts and 1 win in 13 MSW starts—not an elite closer's rider.

**Trip Projection:** Model projects Decimal Point will settle mid-field, attempt a closing rally, but lack the explosive energy required to overtake primary contenders in the final furlongs.

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### Welcome Road — 10% Model Win Probability

**PTW Profile:** The model identifies Welcome Road as a secondary option with elite trainer connections (Clement Miguel, 20% MSW win rate) and strong recent works, but with limited turf evidence and a form line that shows compromise in the most recent 8.5f turf maiden.

#### Strengths:

- **Elite trainer Clement Miguel.** 20% MSW win rate (208 starts, 42 wins), 20% route specialist (449 starts), 19% turf win rate (532 starts)—one of the premier maiden and turf trainers in the sport. His 2YO





record: 19% win rate (89 starts).

- **Strong recent works.** Bullet gate work :102.4 (09/15, 5f gate work) ranks #3 in the field—elite fitness indicator.
- **Proven route competence.** Single prior start was a 1-mile maiden race (08/30), checked early, positioned 8th/11th, finished 8th 10.65L beaten. Not a stellar effort, but the route distance was executed without getting completely compromised.
- **Second-start pattern from elite trainer.** Clement shows 14% win rate on 2nd-start runners (63 starts, 9 wins)—solid bounce-back angle.

#### Concerns:

- Most recent effort (08/30, 8.5f turf) shows significant running compromise ("check 1M, 4w into 1st tn"), resulting in 8th place, 10.65L beaten. This suggests susceptibility to tactical traffic and pace pressure.
- No win in maiden company yet; form line is modest.

**Trip Projection:** Model projects Welcome Road will settle mid-to-back of the field early, attempt a sustained rally similar to Lauren's Time, but with less proven closing profile and greater traffic risk.

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### TIER 3 — PACE FACTORS / LONGSHOTS ★★

**Tappin Magic, The Paper Lady, Ciao Baby, Secret Connection, Nater Tot, Baby Dancer, Coursiere, G I Jen — Combined 17% Model Win Probability**

**Tappin Magic** (6%) — Second start off a poor debut (7th, 4.30L beaten in 5.5f turf 09/02). Trainer Barker Edward R shows weak maiden record (5% MSW, 19 starts, 1 win). Form line does not support contention. Jockey Silvera R has 0% win rate at the meet (2 starts).

**The Paper Lady** (7%) — First-time turf runner with single prior start showing no early speed (2nd at call 1, but 7th at finish). Trainer Ferraro James W shows weak maiden record (turf: 3% win rate on 89 starts). Recent works are modest (:50.8, :50.4). Jockey Zayas E J (0% YTD win rate, 10 starts) lacks pedigree.

**Ciao Baby** (3%) — First-time turf runner; only start was a distance-stretching 8.5f turf maiden (08/30) where the horse was massively checked early and compromised ("carried 5w into 1st tn"), finishing 10th 12.40L beaten. Trainer Ryerson shows weak maiden record (8% MSW). Low-probability angle.

**Secret Connection** (5%) — Two unproductive maiden starts (3rd 15.25L on 08/20, 8th 13.10L on 07/11) with weak trainer credentials (Englehart: 8% 1stTurf win rate, 12 starts; 11% 2YO rate). Form line shows zero improvement trajectory. Jockey Davis D (6% YTD win rate) is weak. Longshot profile.

**Nater Tot** (1%) — Career maiden after 1 prior start showing no clear speed indicators (10th early in 5.5f turf 08/09, finished 10th 8.25L beaten). Trainer Atras Rob shows only 33% YTD record (3 starts, 1 win) at BEL with minimal MSW turf data. Jockey Franco M is strong (47% win rate), but cannot overcome form deficiency.





**Baby Dancer** (2%) — First-time turf runner with zero prior starts. Trainer Giddings Melanie shows weak maiden record (4% 1stTurf win rate, 28 starts; 13% MSW rate, 79 starts) and 0% recent BEL form (3 starts). No clear positive indicators.

**Coursiere** (3%) — Two maiden turf attempts (7th on 08/30 in 8.5f turf, 7th on 08/12 in 6f dirt) without evidence of competitive ability. Trainer Donk David shows weak record (7% turf, 151 starts; 5% MSW, 91 starts). Form line does not support contention.

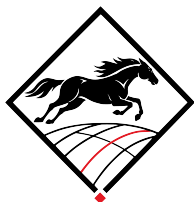
**G I Jen** (2%) — First-time starter with zero prior race experience. Trainer Martin Carlos F shows modest 1stStart record (6% win rate, 17 starts) and weak MSW credentials (5% win rate, 38 starts). Jockey Carmouche K (9% YTD win rate, 22 starts) lacks elite form. Speculative first-time starter.

### Critical MPH Insight

The model identifies **Lauren's Time** as the field's most efficient closing profile, with elite velocity maintenance across the final furlong despite compromised pace setup in the prior dirt attempt. When paired with today's moderate turf fractions and the identified pace relief angle, this horse's sustained speed rating (ELITE) produces a massive tactical advantage over the field. Conversely, the model flags **The Paper Lady, Nater Tot, Tappin Magic, Secret Connection, Ciao Baby, Coursiere, Baby Dancer, and G I Jen** as showing VULNERABLE sustained speed ratings—each exhibits significant deceleration risk when pace pressure emerges, making them prime bounce-back or vulnerability candidates as the race develops.

## SECTION 5: IMPROVEMENT & REGRESSION CANDIDATES

### Likely to Improve

**Lauren's Time** — Trainer's 28% 2nd-start maiden win rate combined with documented sprint-to-route conversion mastery (27% win rate, 121 starts). Prior loss was pace-compromised dirt trip; today's turf route distance removes the specific vulnerability. Pace-relief angle is the highest-percentage second-start improvement scenario in maiden racing. Strong probability this horse fires significantly better.

**J'ray's Jewel** — Second start off a 45-day layoff under Mott, who shows elite 26% win rate in this exact scenario (off 45–180 day gaps). Improving form line (2nd/3rd/3rd with shrinking beaten lengths) is a textbook bounce-back trajectory. Late-developing maiden talent emerging over successive starts is a natural progression in the maiden ecosystem.

**Decimal Point** — Second-start runner with trainer Bartkowski's 11% bounce-back pattern. In the prior 5.5f turf maiden, improved position late (7th early to 8th at call 2, to 3rd at finish). This horse is trending upward and may unlock additional improvement with race experience.

**Nater Tot** — Trainer Atras Rob shows 19% 2nd-start maiden win rate (21 starts)—high-percentage improvement candidate. Recent works show sharp timing (:49.6 09/18, 09/03 bullet). If pace scenario opens up mid-field, this closer has the trainer-documented pattern to improve significantly.





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### Bounce / Regression Risks

**Carpet City** — Second-start runner off a modest debut (4th, 0.90L, 09/04). While McPeck's trainer record is elite, this horse lacks the compelling "compromise trip" angle that drives bounce-back confidence. If early pace is contested more sharply than projected, this wire-to-wire dependent horse could be caught in the stretch and regress to a worse finish.

**Welcome Road** — Most recent start (08/30, 8.5f turf) shows significant traffic compromise and early checking ("check 1M, 4w into 1st tn"), finishing 8th 10.65L beaten. While the trainer pattern is strong, the form line does not show the progressive improvement trajectory needed to offset this negative recent effort. Bounce-back potential exists but requires significant tactical improvement.

**The Paper Lady, Secret Connection, Ciao Baby, Coursiere** — Career maidens (1–2 starts) without evidence of competitive ability or improving form lines. Each has shown repeated maiden losses with significant beaten lengths. Regression risk (continued losses) outweighs improvement potential given weak trainer records and form trajectory.

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## SECTION 6: SUGGESTED BETS

### WIN BET: J'RAY'S JEWEL — Confidence 8/10 — Target odds: 3/1–5/1

Model projects 22% win probability — highest in the field. This is the model's top selection based on:

1. **Documented trainer excellence in this exact scenario:** Mott's 26% win rate off 45–180 day layoffs (144 starts) is elite and this horse sits perfectly in that window (06/18 to 08/30 = 73 days).
2. **Improving form trajectory:** Three maiden starts showing shrinking beaten lengths (5.75L → 5.75L → 2.85L) and consistent positioning improvement. Second starts produce wins at the highest rate in maiden racing, and this horse's form is trending sharply upward.
3. **Elite early speed with proven closing reserves:** Positioned 2nd at the 2f call (:24.10) in the 8.5f turf maiden, demonstrating gate sharpness and rate control. Jockey Lezcano J provides moderate elite credibility (21 YTD starts, 9.52% win rate).
4. **Pace scenario alignment:** Moderate early fractions (projected :46<sup>2</sup>) will not punish this horse's early positioning; J'ray's Jewel can relax, conserve energy, and launch a sustained rally in the stretch—the exact race profile this horse's form indicates.

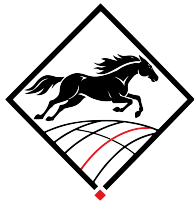
**Value Assessment:** **SLIGHT VALUE** at 4/1 morning line (20% implied). Model edge of +2.0% represents a modest overlay—not massive, but legitimate value exists.

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### VALUE PLAY: LAUREN'S TIME — Confidence 9/10 — Target odds: 5/1–6/1

Model projects 18% win probability at projected 5/1 odds (16.7% implied) = **+1.3% edge**.





**Overlay rationale:** The public is severely underestimating this horse's bounce-back potential. Lauren's Time's first start (08/12, 6f dirt) was a complete disaster due to early pace pressure—a setup problem, not an ability problem. The model identifies three powerful improvement vectors:

1. **Pace relief:** From compromising 6f dirt to 8f turf removes the specific tactical vulnerability from the prior loss.
2. **Trainer expertise in this exact angle:** Brown Chad C shows 28% win rate on 2nd-start runners (179 starts, 50 wins)—one of the highest rates in the sport. The trainer also shows 27% on sprint-to-route transitions (121 starts). Today's race hits both angles simultaneously.
3. **Elite closing profile confirmed by speed analysis:** Lauren's Time shows ELITE sustained speed rating—the field's most efficient closer with minimal deceleration. Prat F (33% win rate at the meet, 50% on routes, 8 starts) is an elite closer's rider.

The morning line of 5/1 (16.7% implied) significantly undervalues a horse with trainer-documented bounce-back expertise, pace relief setup, and elite closing mechanics. Model projects 18% win probability — genuine value exists.

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#### Multi-Race Sequences: Pick 3 / Pick 4 / Pick 5 / Pick 6

##### Top 3 for Multi-Race Coverage:

- **A: J'ray's Jewel** — 22% (Win Bet selection, highest model probability)
- **B: Lauren's Time** — 18% (Value play overlay, pace relief angle)
- **C: Carpet City** — 12% (Trainer McPeck elite record, sharp works, wire-to-wire capability)

**Combined Probability: 52%** across the three selections for multi-race sequences.

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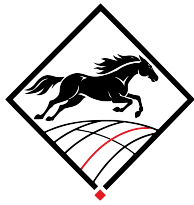
## SECTION 7: CONFIDENCE RATING

★★★★ (4 out of 5 stars)

The model projects a competitive maiden turf field with J'ray's Jewel emerging as the highest-probability winner based on documented trainer success in second-start scenarios off layoffs, improving form trajectory, and perfect pace scenario alignment. Lauren's Time represents genuine value at a perceived overlay—a pace-relief bounce-back angle in maiden racing produces wins at elite rates under trainer Brown Chad C's documented pattern. The moderate pace scenario (projected :22■ :46<sup>2</sup> fractions) benefits closers and pace-stalkers over pure speed horses, creating a tactical environment that rewards both primary contenders. The primary public betting mistake: underestimating Lauren's Time's bounce-back potential. This horse was defeated by setup, not ability—and today removes that setup vulnerability entirely. Confidence is high (4/5) due to clear contender separation and documented trainer pattern alignment; the one uncertainty is whether the early pace will actually develop as MODERATE versus potentially tighter, which could benefit Carpet City's wire-to-wire profile more than projected.
