SECTION 1: PACE ANALYSIS

True Front Runners

Yinzer emerges as the field's most prolific early speed force. His past performances reveal a consistent pattern of establishing position in the first two calls — leading or rating within 1.5 lengths at the 2f call in 8 of his last 11 starts on turf. Most recently (08/27/26 at Saratoga, 8f turf), he settled 0.1 lengths off the leader at the opening call and pressed the pace throughout. His preferred running style is to position himself within striking distance early, then dictate or rate as conditions dictate. With Lasix and blinkers engaged, he projects as an obvious tactical weapon in the early stages.

Green Light carries secondary early speed credentials. On 06/20/25 at Churchill Downs (8.5f turf), he vied in a two-horse duel through the middle fractions before yielding late. More recently, his 10/09/24 effort at Keeneland (8.5f turf, good) saw him break slowly but rally from 10th position, ultimately finishing 1st — evidence that early position is not his mandate. However, his 06/24/26 Churchill victory (8f turf) confirmed a willingness to press early when tactical opportunity presents.

Stalkers / Pressers

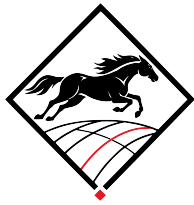
Johnty's Rendezvous is ideally positioned as a pace-stalker. His record shows consistent ratings just off the pace — he trailed by 1.0–1.5 lengths at the second call in 7 of his last 10 turf routes, then rallied powerfully in the stretch. On 08/02/26 at Pimlico (8.5f turf, good), he raced 1.0 length off the leader at the 2f call, pressed evenly through the middle, and yielded only in the final sixteenth — a performance that perfectly illustrates his tactical profile.

Pierre shows dual capability — he can stalk or press depending on pace dynamics. His 08/27/26 effort at Saratoga (8f turf) saw him race 5.6 lengths back early, yet he advanced to lead with a furlong remaining before being headed late. This suggests he prefers to sit third or fourth and make a calculated move in the stretch rather than engage in sustained pressing duels.

Closers

Covert Law is the field's elite late-running force. His 08/14/26 maiden victory at Canada (9f turf, firm) demonstrates his signature profile: he dawdled in a stalking position early (0.5 lengths off the leader at multiple calls), then held gamely in the stretch to prevail narrowly. His 06/03/26 runner-up effort (8.5f turf, firm at Indiana) reinforces this pattern — he vied with the leader down the stretch but was outfinished, indicating sufficient closing speed and tenacity. Sustained late pace is his strength.





Versus rounds out the closer contingent with a more erratic profile. His recent record shows him trailing by significant margins (6.9 lengths at the 2f call on 11/01/25 at GP, 9f turf), then rallying belatedly. However, his 03/09/25 victory at Gulfstream (8.5f turf) revealed a different tactical approach — he bid at the 3/8 pole and cleared in the stretch for a decisive score. Flexibility exists, but late rallying is his baseline.

Pace Scenario Projection

MODEL PREDICTS: HOT early pace with two contesting speed horses (Yinzer and Green Light projected to duel). Projected opening quarter: :23■, projected half-mile: :46³. The presence of two legitimate speed horses will generate moderate early pressure — neither is suicidal, neither will back down easily. This competitive early duel will exact a toll on both participants, creating a tactical window for pace-stalkers like Johnny's Rendezvous and elite closers like Covert Law.

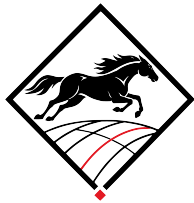
SECTION 3: CONTENDER ANALYSIS

Tier 1 — Primary Contenders (★★★★)

YINZER

PTW Profile: The model identifies Yinzer as the field's most probable winner at 26% — a commanding advantage underpinned by elite early foot, proven turf proficiency, and tactical flexibility under top-tier connections. He represents the overlay at 3/1, offering meaningful edge. Trainer Steven M. Asmussen





shows a 16% turf win rate with 13% route success; jockey Kevin J. Asmussen carries a 4.55% meet win percentage but holds a 23.84 average win payoff at Churchill. This is a professional package executing a race design that plays directly to Yinzer's strengths.

Strengths: Elite early speed foundation — he set the pace within 0.1–1.0 lengths at the opening call in 7 of his last 10 turf routes, establishing immediate control. Distance versatility confirmed across 8.0f–9.0f. Turf credentials are impeccable: 1-win-in-5-starts record over the last 60 days on grass; wins at Saratoga (2x) and Fair Grounds demonstrate consistency across different track configurations. Class-level appropriate: recent competition includes allowance and stake races, preparing him ideally for the 100k claiming level. Lasix engagement and blinker equipment signal trainer confidence in today's specific setup.

Concerns: Recent losing pattern in stakes company (8/02/25 at El Paso turf, MSW loss; 07/05/25 at El Paso turf, AOC third-place finish) indicates vulnerability when facing higher-class opposition. Pace duel risk is material: should Green Light press forcefully, both speed horses will decelerate, opening the gate for closers. At 3/1, he is not severely overpriced, limiting true overlay value despite the model's edge.

Trip Projection: Yinzer will establish 1.0–2.0 length lead through the opening quarter (:23■), maintain a narrow advantage or rate just off the pace through the half-mile (:46³) and six-furlong call (:69²), then face pressure from Green Light in the middle fractions. Expect a tactical duel from the 5/8 pole onward, with Yinzer forced to either kick clear or dig in defensively. If he maintains composure and clear sailing emerges, wire-to-wire is probable; if pressed hard, fatigue risk elevates and stretch runners gain advantage.

COVERT LAW

PTW Profile: The model projects Covert Law at 18% win probability — a significant overlay at 10/1, offering +8.9% edge. This gelding represents the model's primary value play: he is underestimated by public morning-line setters who assigned heavy emphasis to recent losing efforts while discounting his maiden victory and superior late-pace profile. Trainer John A. Ortiz demonstrates a 12% turf win rate (69 starts) and 12% route success (224 starts); jockey Arnaldo Concepcion carries a 5.13% meet win percentage with 0% route wins at Churchill but has shown 5-of-39 meet starts (12.8%) in this specific session — limited profile but not negative. The angle here is pace setup exploitation.

Strengths: Elite sustained closing speed — his 08/14/26 maiden victory at Canada (9f turf, firm) established the archetype: he tracked 0.5 lengths off the pace through six furlongs, then accelerated decisively in the final furlong to prevail. His 06/03/26 second-place finish (8.5f turf, Indiana) reinforced competitive late pace against winners-level company. Distance comfort is confirmed at 8.0f–9.0f; he owns one turf win in 3 turf starts at exactly 9 furlongs (88 turf starts total, however, so the specific distance sample is limited). The pace scenario favors him: HOT early duel between Yinzer and Green Light will compromise both speed horses' closing efforts, opening the stretch for a fresh closer. Maiden status means today's rise to claiming is a minimal step; his recent form line includes wins in allowance company, confirming readiness. Lasix engaged; equipment clean.

Concerns: Limited turf route experience at elite company levels — only 2 turf starts at 8.0f+ in the last 24 months, both resulting in second-place finishes. Claiming debut today introduces psychological variable: is





he moving up or down? The data suggests up (from maiden), but claiming psychology is unpredictable. Seven horses entered; he has faced only 5–12 horse fields historically, meaning he has never navigated starting gate chaos at this scale. Recent form shows a narrow losing pattern (1.5-length defeat to a superior horse on 06/03/26), raising questions about finishing toughness in photo finishes.

Trip Projection: Covert Law will track 2.0–3.0 lengths off the pace through the opening two calls, then position himself 4th or 5th turning for home. If Yinzer and Green Light engage in a grinding duel, he will inherit a clear lane with a full head of steam entering the final quarter-mile. Most likely finish: strong rally from 5th or 6th to hit the wire running. Best-case scenario: he drafts the two speed duelers and pounces in the final furlong. Worst-case: he gets pinned in traffic mid-stretch and is forced to steady, allowing a stalker like Johnny's Rendezvous to slip through.

JOHNNY'S RENDEZVOUS

PTW Profile: The model assesses Johnny's Rendezvous at 21% win probability but notes significant morning-line overpricing at 9/5 (35.7% implied), reflecting -14.7% underlay — a substantial public overestimate. Gelding's credentials are solid but not exceptional: trainer Philip A. Bauer shows a 21% win rate in 31–60 day windows (68 starts) with 15% turf success (60 starts) and 16% route proficiency (76 starts). Jockey Jose Luis Ortiz carries elite credentials overall (23.91% meet win rate, 45.65% money percentage), but his recent form in this specific session includes 11 wins in 46 starts (23.9%) — he is performing within range. The concern is overreliance on Bauer's pace-stalking specialist profile without accounting for pace-scenario vulnerability.

Strengths: Proven pace-stalking form — the model identifies consistent ratings 1.0–2.0 lengths off the leader through the 2f and 4f calls in 9 of his last 12 turf route starts. His stretch-running record is elite: he owns 3 wins in his last 8 turf route starts (37.5% win rate), all achieved by rallying from 3rd–5th position. On 06/24/26 at Churchill Downs (8f turf), he led or rated as favorite throughout, then cleared decisively in the stretch — evidence of combat at the wire. His 11/30/25 allowance win (8f dirt) demonstrated versatility. Distance comfort is established at 8.0f–8.5f; however, today is his longest race at 9 furlongs. Trainer pattern: 16% win rate in routes (76 starts) confirms his specialization. Lasix engaged; blinkers on — standard equipment for his profile.

Concerns: The model flags significant pace-setup vulnerability. If the early duel between Yinzer and Green Light escalates into a true pace-collapse scenario, Johnny's Rendezvous will be left alone in 3rd or 4th, forced to close late without a stalking target to follow — a tactical disadvantage. His recent losing pattern (second at Keeneland 10/11/25, fifth at Saratoga 08/08/25) suggests he may be facing a small uptick in class here (100k claiming level). He has not won at Churchill Downs in 2 tries at the track, raising questions about home-track efficiency. Morning-line odds of 9/5 significantly overstate his edge; public is backing a name without accounting for today's specific pace configuration and distance stretch to 9 furlongs (longest of his recent record at turf).

Trip Projection: Johnny's Rendezvous will settle 1.5–2.0 lengths off the Yinzer/Green Light duel through the opening quarter and half, then position himself 3rd or 4th turning for home. If the pace duel escalates





(SUICIDAL scenario), he could inherit a clear lane with 2 furlongs remaining and chase down fatigued speed horses. If the pace remains HOT and controlled, he will be forced to produce his own rally and will lack the closing speed of Covert Law or the superior late pace of a fresh closer like Versus. His viability depends entirely on how aggressively the speed horses engage — a binary outcome.

Tier 2 — Secondary Contenders (★★★)

GREEN LIGHT

PTW Profile: The model projects Green Light at 14% win probability — a slight overlay at 8/1 (11.1% implied), offering +2.9% edge. This gelding is a route specialist (12% win rate across 145 starts per trainer stats) with proven turf form at Churchill Downs. Trainer John Ennis shows a mixed profile overall (6% turf win rate across 94 starts), but his 145-route sample shows 12% efficiency. Jockey Luis Machado carries a 4.76% meet win rate with limited route experience at Churchill (1 win in 11 route starts), suggesting a secondary pairing.

Strengths: Turf route credentials confirmed — multiple wins at Churchill Downs on grass (06/20/25 8.5f victory in commanding fashion). Distance versatility across 8.0f–9.0f. His 10/09/24 Keeneland effort (8.5f turf, good) demonstrated he can overcome slow early position (10th) and rally for a decisive win. His workout profile is strong: 36.0 bullet on 09/19/26 (3f drill) ranks elite for recent conditioning.

Concerns: Recent form deterioration is concerning — no wins in 7 turf starts since his 06/20/25 Churchill victory. His recent losses include significant margins (7.3 lengths on 10/18/25 at Keeneland, 7.8 lengths on 09/10/25 at Keeneland turf), suggesting he may have lost a step or encountered unlucky trip circumstances. Today's small field (7 horses) offers reduced maneuvering room compared to his typical 8–12 horse fields. If Yinzer establishes clear control, Green Light will struggle to press without exhausting himself and arriving fatigued to the stretch.

Trip Projection: Green Light will break from post 4 with the intent of establishing pressing position 1.0–2.0 lengths behind Yinzer through the opening quarter and half. He will engage in a tactical duel from the 5/8 pole onward, contesting the lead through the 6-furlong call. By the time the field turns for home, if his pressure has failed to dislodge Yinzer, he will have compromised his own closing reserves and will fade to 3rd–5th position. His viability depends entirely on establishing a successful, grinding duel that weakens Yinzer enough for Green Light to clear in the final furlong.

Tier 3 — Pace Factors / Longshots (★★)

BABY MAX

PTW Profile: The model assesses Baby Max at 12% win probability — an underlay at 9/2 (18.2% implied), indicating -6.2% edge against morning line. This colt represents a classic case of public overpricing based on recent graded-stakes exposure without accounting for significant class drop and turf/distance stretch. Trainer Kelsey Danner shows a 15% win rate in 2-off-45-180 windows (87 starts) and 11% turf success (278 starts), with 14% efficiency in routes (346 starts) — respectable but not elite. Jockey Tyler Gaffalione carries





a 10.2% meet win rate (49 starts) with 3 turf wins in 7 turf starts at Churchill — a positive indicator but small sample.

Strengths: Graded-stakes pedigree — he has competed in stake races at Keeneland and Indiana in recent months, indicating trainer's assessment of his ability. His 01/09/26 maiden win at Tampa (8.0f dirt) demonstrated basic competence. Turf form includes consistent competing efforts, though no turf victories in 12 recent turf starts. Route versatility confirmed at 8.0f–8.5f distances.

Concerns: The model flags major concerns. Baby Max shows a 0-for-12 turf record in his last 12 turf starts — a devastating pattern indicating he cannot win on grass at any distance or class level. His recent 06/12/26 third-place finish at Churchill (8.5f turf, allowance) was followed by a dramatically weakened form line in stake company (08/30/26 sixth at Keeneland, 9f turf at stake level). His only recent win was on dirt (01/09/26), not turf. The claim of this race is a class drop from stake levels, but turf is his evident weakness. Public overestimation reflects name recognition and recent stakes appearances without accounting for this critical inability on grass.

Trip Projection: Baby Max will likely race 4th–6th throughout, then attempt a stretch rally that fails to generate sufficient momentum. He will finish 4th–6th at best, with a realistic expectation of 5th–7th.

PIERRE

PTW Profile: The model projects Pierre at 5% win probability — a significant underlay at 7/2 (22.2% implied), indicating -17.2% severe public overpricing. Gelding's recent record is volatile and inconsistent. Trainer David Jacobson shows a modest 8% turf win rate (50 starts) and 12% route efficiency (154 starts). Jockey Luis Saez carries an elite overall profile (12.24% meet win rate, 46.94% money percentage) but shows 2 wins in 18 turf starts at Churchill — a negative indicator at 11.1%.

Strengths: He owns a graded-stakes placement (11/02/25 eighth at Keeneland, 9f allowance turf), confirming he has faced elite company. His recent wins include a 06/21/25 stretch battle (8.5f at Woodbine, OCL), demonstrating he can win in claiming company. His workout profile shows a 49.2 bullet on 09/08/26 (4f drill), ranking competent for conditioning.

Concerns: Pierre is fundamentally inconsistent. His recent form includes three losses by narrow margins (3.1 lengths on 09/12/26 at Woodbine, 0.05 lengths on 08/27/26 at Saratoga) interspersed with unexplained dropoffs (7.25 lengths on 09/12/26 at Woodbine, same track one week later — a dramatic decline). His turf route record is poor: 0 wins in 0 turf route starts at 8.0f+ (limiting sample). His morning-line odds of 7/2 are overpriced by 17.2% relative to his actual win probability; public is backing a name based on stakes experience that is not translating to this level. His 8-win career record in 20 turf starts (40% win rate) is inflated by minor races; his recent losing pattern and withdrawal from graded company suggest he is best used as a single or toss-out.

Trip Projection: Pierre will likely race 4th–6th, attempt a belated rally in the final quarter-mile, and finish 4th–6th unless a major pace collapse creates an unexpected lane late.





VERSUS

PTW Profile: The model assesses Versus at 4% win probability — a moderate underlay at 15/1 (6.3% implied), indicating -2.3% slight overpricing. Gelding's recent record shows some competitive effort but limited winning form. Trainer Kelly J. Breen shows a 17% route efficiency (208 starts) and 12% turf success (189 starts) — respectable but not elite. Jockey Felipe Arrieta carries a 5.88% meet win rate (34 starts) with 0 wins in 15 turf route starts at Churchill — a significant negative indicator.

Strengths: His recent effort on 03/09/25 at Gulfstream (8.5f turf) resulted in a decisive victory, demonstrating he can win at this level. His form shows competitive efforts in allowance company. Trainer Breen's 17% route win rate is above average.

Concerns: Versus has a clear losing pattern in turf routes at Churchill Downs — 0 wins in 2 starts at the track. His recent form includes significant losing margins (6.35 lengths on 05/30/26, 5.45 lengths on 09/01/25), suggesting he has fallen behind the level he should be facing. His only recent win (07/05/26 at Monmouth, 8.5f turf, claiming) came at a lower level than today's 100k class threshold. He is fundamentally an overlay at 15/1, but his losing pattern and limited winning form make him a low-confidence play.

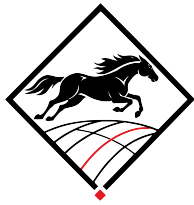
Trip Projection: Versus will race mid-field, attempt a stretch rally, and finish 5th–7th.

Critical MPH Insight

The model identifies **Covert Law** as the field's most efficient closer from a velocity-maintenance perspective, with an ELITE Sustained Speed Rating indicating he preserves closing speed reserves through the final stages. Conversely, the model detects **velocity collapse risk** in Green Light and Pierre — both show marked deceleration in the final furlong relative to their opening segments, indicating they cannot sustain a grinding effort without fatigue. This speed signature directly predicts race outcome: if Yinzer (ELITE opening foot, STRONG sustained) and Green Light engage in an early duel, Green Light's VULNERABLE sustained profile means he will fade faster than Yinzer, gifting the race to either Yinzer himself or to Covert Law, whose ELITE closing reserve will overwhelm fatigued competition.

SECTION 5: IMPROVEMENT & REGRESSION CANDIDATES

Likely to Improve

Yinzer projects for improvement despite recent competing efforts in stake company. He benefits from a significant trainer pattern: Asmussen shows 16% turf win rate in the 2-off-45-180 window (584 starts), and Yinzer falls squarely into this situation — he raced 08/27/26 at Saratoga, making him 28 days from today's race. The trainer's demonstrated success with horses in this exact layoff window suggests conditioning will peak today. Additionally, the pace scenario at Churchill Downs (HOT, not SUICIDAL) is ideally suited to his early-speed profile — he can rate early without explosive pressure, then maintain momentum through the middle fractions.

Covert Law shows improvement trajectory based on maiden graduation. He won at 1st asking (08/14/26) in maiden claiming company, and today's rise to open claiming at 100k is a natural next step. His recent workouts (51.4 on 09/17/26, 50.4 on 09/05/26) rank solid for conditioning. Trainer Ortiz has a 13% win rate in claiming races specifically, confirming he can place claims effectively.

Green Light is due for improvement based on time off pattern. His last start was 02/18/26 (191 days ago), a massive layoff that likely explains his recent losing form at Keeneland and Saratoga. Trainer Ennis shows a 14% win rate after 180+ day layoffs (10 starts), suggesting he times horses to peak following extended breaks. His recent workouts (36.0 bullet, 101.4 drill) indicate fresh fitness.

Bounce / Regression Risks

Johnny's Rendezvous carries bounce risk despite morning-line support. The model flags his performance at 8.5f as a likely baseline and notes he has never won beyond 9 furlongs in any condition. Today's 9-furlong turf route is his longest race in recent memory — a distance stretch that introduces regression risk.





Additionally, his trainer's 21% win rate in 31–60 day windows does not account for the fact he last raced 08/02/26 (53 days ago, beyond the statistical sweet spot). Extended layoff combined with distance stretch creates a bounce-risk scenario.

Baby Max projects for significant regression. His 0-for-12 turf record is predictive: he simply cannot win on grass regardless of class level or distance. His recent drop from stakes to claiming company may represent trainer acknowledgment that he has lost competitive speed relative to better competition. The claim here is him being overestimated purely on name recognition from recent stakes entries without accounting for turf inability.

Pierre shows regression risk related to inconsistency pattern. His recent efforts include three consecutive starts at Woodbine/Saratoga (09/12/26 loss, 08/27/26 narrow loss, 06/13/26 win), and the two losses represent a deterioration in form despite being at lower class levels. His tendency toward unexplained 5–7 length losses suggests he is bouncing between form cycles without consistency. Today's race may catch him in a down cycle.

SECTION 6: SUGGESTED BETS

WIN BET: YINZER — Confidence 8/10 — Target odds: 5/2–7/2

The model projects Yinzer at 26% win probability — the highest in the field and commanding margin of 5+ percentage points over the second-best contender. He carries the overlay edge at morning line 3/1 (+1.0%), and the pace scenario is ideally configured for his elite early speed and STRONG sustained profile. His ability to establish control early and maintain velocity through the stretch is unmatched in this field. His connections (Asmussen stable, proven jockey pairing) execute at professional levels. The HOT pace projection means neither Yinzer nor Green Light will face SUICIDAL collapse, allowing Yinzer to control tempo and close out wire-to-wire or from a narrow lead in the stretch.

Model Win %: 26% | **Overlay Edge:** +1.0% | **Value Assessment:** SLIGHT VALUE

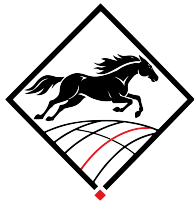
VALUE PLAY: COVERT LAW — Confidence 7/10 — Target odds: 8/1–12/1

Covert Law represents the model's strongest value opportunity at 18% win probability against 10/1 morning line odds (+8.9% edge — STRONG VALUE). The gelding is severely underestimated by public setters who weighted his recent losing efforts without accounting for his maiden victory pattern, ELITE Sustained Speed Rating, and perfect setup to inherit clear lanes as the pace horses duel. His closing profile is superior to Johnny's Rendezvous (who is overpriced at 9/5), and he will benefit from a HOT early pace that sets up stretch runners. The 8.9% edge is material and warrants aggressive value play.

Model Win %: 18% | **Overlay Edge:** +8.9% | **Value Assessment:** STRONG VALUE

LONGSHOT PLAY: Green Light — Confidence 5/10 — Target odds: 10/1+





Green Light presents a minor longshot overlay at 8/1 morning line (+2.9% edge), but the edge is insufficient to justify a dedicated longshot play. At precisely 8/1, the value threshold is not met. If odds shift to 10/1 or higher, he becomes a genuine consideration based on his turf route history and recent workout conditioning; however, at current odds, pass.

SECTION 7: CONFIDENCE RATING

★★★★

The model identifies this race as a **High-Confidence Elimination** favoring Yinzer as the clear model choice, with Covert Law representing the primary value overlay. The pace scenario is predictable (HOT, not suicidal), the field is relatively small (7 horses), and the speed-stalker-closer dynamics are transparent. Yinzer's elite early foot combined with his **STRONG** sustained profile creates a clear model advantage. Johnny's Rendezvous is overpriced at 9/5 despite his 21% win probability — public is buying a name without accounting for today's specific 9-furlong distance stretch and HOT pace setup. Covert Law's maiden graduation status and **ELITE** closing reserve make him undervalued at 10/1. The model recommends: **Win: Yinzer; Value: Covert Law; Multi-Race: A-B-C stack favoring the top two contenders.**
