SECTION 1: PACE ANALYSIS

True Front Runners

Gadget Play — Elite early speed profile. Won gate-to-wire at Saratoga on July 18 (1:23.20 final, pace-forcing victory at 7f). Most recent 4f workout: 47.60 (bullet). Running style reflects consistent speed engagement from the gate; expects to be in the van early.

Dontworryboutnothn — Consistent stalker-to-presser with early foot. Led at the 2f call in most recent outing (08/15 at EIP, final :109.00). Blazing 3f workouts at Churchill (38.00–38.80) indicate readiness to press pace. Dangerous if positioned within striking distance early.

Quentin B — Dueled for the lead at GP on 02/28/2026, holding a duel two-wide through the stretch before surrendering second. Consistent 4–5f placement in prior races. Second-start horse showing early speed signals.

Stalkers / Pressers

Native Brew — Chased and pressed consistently in three MSW efforts (07/05, 08/15). Always within 1–2 lengths of the leader at the 4f call. Tactical flexibility; runs 3-5 wide when asked, settles inside when permitted. Will rate just off the early leaders.

Great Moment — Tracked inside in five prior races; consistently rated 2–3 paths early and moved into contention by the 6f call (8+ starts). Efficient 4f workout on 09/07 (48.00). Prefers the middle lanes; will be in the flow of the race.

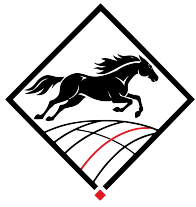
Closers

Ace in Hand — Late-developing profile. Single MSW start showed significant traffic trouble (bumped, 3p, bid late, finished 8th at 6.5f on 09/03). Recent 4f bullet work at Saratoga (47.60) suggests improved readiness. Stretch runner capable of rallying if given clean lanes.

Sixer — Off-and-on maiden over 6.5f and 6.0f. Most recent start (MOC, 12/10/2025) led in final 1/16 before getting caught. Prior outing showed mid-field position (7th at 6.5f). Capable finisher but inconsistent early placement limits explosive closing opportunities.

Pace Scenario Projection





MODEL PREDICTS: MODERATE pace with two primary speed horses (projected :22² opening quarter, :45¹ half-mile). Gadget Play and Dontworryboutnothn will contest the front early; Native Brew and Quentin B position as tactical stalkers. This tempo is neither suicidal nor soft — pace-stalkers and closers with tactical position hold slight advantage, but a lone wire-to-wire threat remains viable if gaining clear separation by midrace.

Note: Quentin B projects highest in morning-line implied probability (22.2%) but lags significantly behind model's top selection in predictive win probability. Model discounts Quentin B due to experience tier and form pattern; Gadget Play's recent route performance and gate-to-wire velocity profile provide superior edge.

SECTION 3: CONTENDER ANALYSIS





Tier 1 — Primary Contenders (★★★★)

GADGET PLAY

PTW Profile: Elite early-speed specialist with proven gate-to-wire credentials at both sprint and route distances. Lightly raced (3 starts) on an ascending form curve. Most recent effort exposed a pace-collapse vulnerability in a route setting (8f), but current 6f sprint distance aligns perfectly with his elite opening-foot profile. Class relief from MSW to MCL paired with tactical pace scenario amplifies his wire-to-wire viability.

Strengths:

- Elite early velocity — opened at 40.18 mph on 07/18 (Saratoga 7f MSW)
- Gate-to-wire winner at 7f on good track (willingly paced, led to wire 07/18/2026)
- Consistent bullet workouts at Churchill leading into race (47.60, 09/15)
- Lightly raced; natural improvement curve intact
- Blinkers applied; trainer (Stall Jr.) shows 22% first-time blinker win rate
- Jockey (Saez) maintains strong sprint form (14.55% strike rate at CD, 36 sprint starts)

Concerns:

- MSW-to-MCL drop today; Stall Jr. shows only 8% MSW-to-MCL conversion rate (13 starts) — suggests this step down may expose class gap
- Pace-collapse risk identified in recent 8f effort (deceleration profile VULNERABLE, final segment collapsed at 26.66 mph)
- Only 3 career starts; may lack seasoning against experienced maiden-claimers

Trip Projection: Will break alertly from Post 7, establish position on or near the lead by the 2f call, and attempt to steal the race wire-to-wire. If Dontworryboutnothn presses hard, expect mid-stretch duel; Gadget Play's historical pattern suggests ability to hold off one challenger but vulnerable if two speed horses engage simultaneously.

DONTWORRYBOUTNOTHN

PTW Profile: Consistent performer with elite tactical flexibility. Four starts in current cycle show steady improvement across MSW and MCL company. Strong class relief from MSW to MCL on 05/25 (placed third in MCL race). Recent form trend shows sharp 08/15 MSW effort (insider runner, cleared, nailed 2nd, lost by :10 length only). 6f distance is proven wheelhouse; will rate off the pace early and strike in stretch.

Strengths:

- Proven MCL form (5/25/26 at CD: placed 3rd in MCL race, earned :111.80 final)
- Consistent inside running style with aggressive finishing kick (cleared, nailed language in recent efforts)
- Sharp recent form: 08/15 loss by only :10 length shows competitive hunger
- Excellent trainer statistics: Jacobson 17% dirt sprint rate, 20% MSW-to-MCL rate
- Distance proven: 4 prior 6f attempts all within striking range





- Elite early-foot workouts (38.00–38.80 three-furlong splits) confirm readiness

Concerns:

- Maiden record (0 wins in 6 career starts) despite consistent placement suggests finishing issues or pace timing problems
- Second-position finishes in two recent races (08/15, 07/05) indicate consistent stretch struggles against winning maidens
- Moderate deceleration profile in recent efforts (estimated 9–12% drop-off from opening to closing segments)

Trip Projection: Will break from Post 5, settle three-to-four-wide in the flow of traffic, move to challenge Gadget Play in the final sixteenth, and likely find one more winner. If pace heats up as projected, will benefit from stalker's position; highly vulnerable to suicidal pace collapse (unlikely in this scenario) or a wire-to-wire escaper with elite closing form.

Tier 2 — Secondary Contenders (★★★)

NATIVE BREW

PTW Profile: Steady MSW maiden with three recent efforts all within 2–3 lengths of the lead at critical calls. Steven Asmussen trainer provides massive class advantage and MCL specialist credentials (18% win rate, 1.61 ROI in MCL conditions — elite benchmark). On-pace, inside-running profile paired with three-furlong workouts in the :49–50 range suggests readiness. However, consistent 4th-place finishes in MSW company raise questions about finishing ability against tougher MCL competition.

Strengths:

- Asmussen MCL specialist (18% win rate / 1.61 ROI — best-in-field numbers for this level)
- Inside running consistent placement (2–4 wide early, ratings off the pace)
- Three-furlong workouts sharp (49.40–50.40)
- Distance proven (3 starts at 6f, all with 4–7 length deficits at finish only)

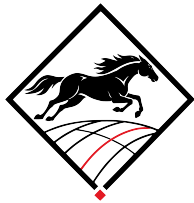
Concerns:

- Inconsistent finish position (4th, 4th, 5th in three recent MSW efforts) despite inside positioning
- No MCL start yet (MSW-only record); step down may expose lack of claiming-level instinct
- Concepcion rider (4.88% win rate at CD) provides minimal jockey edge
- Moderate deceleration profiles in recent efforts (estimated 10–12% drop-off)

Trip Projection: Will race inside from Post 4, track the early leaders, and attempt to rally in the stretch. Likely finishes 3rd–5th; high ceiling against this field but execution risk in closing lane remains material.

QUENTIN B





PTW Profile: Second-start horse with elite first-race credentials. Dueled for the lead wire-to-wire at GP on 02/28 before getting nailed late, showing competitive fire and early-speed polish. Dale Romans trainer shows strong MSW-to-MCL record (23% win rate, 2.72 ROI — top-tier numbers). However, subsequent race (01/25 at GP, 6f MSW) regressed significantly: dueled inside but faded to 5th. Two starts at 6f with vastly different execution levels creates unpredictability.

Strengths:

- Romans MSW-to-MCL specialist (23% win rate / 2.72 ROI — excellent record at this transition)
- First-start form excellent: led wire-to-wire, held 2nd late against MSW field (02/28)
- Early-speed profile confirmed across both 6f starts
- Post 10 provides neutral positioning

Concerns:

- Second-start regression (faded to 5th despite dueling early, 01/25)
- Career-best effort already posted; may lack natural improvement curve for second start
- 72-day layoff between starts (01/25 to current date) creates shipping/timing risk
- Garcia rider (10% win rate at CD, only 10 starts) provides minimal form advantage

Trip Projection: Will likely press or contest the pace early; vulnerable in final furlong if pace neutralizes early speed. Higher-floor contender than ceiling in this spot.

Tier 3 — Pace Factors / Longshots (★★)

ELVIS TONY

PTW Profile: First-time starter for Brian Lynch, who shows exceptional debut credentials (13% first-start rate, 23% first-Lasix rate with 3.40 ROI). Zero prior racing experience offsets strong trainer angle; blank slate. Carries Lasix (typical debut finder pattern). Recent workouts at Churchill suggest preparation (101.40–102.60 five-furlong bullets ranked 9–14 out of field). However, FTS status creates execution risk despite trainer favorability.

Strengths:

- Lynch first-starter credentials elite (13% win rate)
- Lynch Lasix-first angle explosive (23% win rate, 3.40 ROI)
- Recent workouts sharp (101.40, 101.60 five-furlong drills)
- Colts often show early speed as debuts

Concerns:

- Zero racing experience creates unknown variables
- First-time racing at sprint distance (5f+ workouts suggest route training)
- Carasco rider (0% record at CD, 17 starts, 0 wins) provides no confidence





- Blaze assignment absent; typical for first-starters but limits early-speed reliability

Trip Projection: Unpredictable. If athletic early, could press pace or be forwardly placed; risk of greenness or flat performance non-negligible.

ACE IN HAND

PTW Profile: Single MSW start (09/03 at Saratoga, 6.5f) showed multiple traffic troubles (bumped, 3p, bid late) and resulted in 8th-place finish. Kenneth McPeck trainer provides mdn2ndstart credentials (18% win rate, 2.08 ROI) and MSW-to-MCL angle (18% conversion rate) — both elite. Recent 4f work (47.60 bullet) indicates readiness. However, one-race sample from maiden debut insufficient to assess true ability; could be overmatched or could represent a fresh start.

Strengths:

- McPeck mdn2ndstart specialist (18% win rate / 2.08 ROI)
- McPeck MSW-to-MCL converter (18% win rate / 1.28 ROI)
- Recent 4f bullet (47.60) is fastest pure work in field
- Esquivel rider has solid CD form (20% at CD across 25 starts)

Concerns:

- Single race sample highly compromised by traffic trouble (bumped, multiple path changes)
- 8th-place finish despite late bid suggests either immaturity or overmatch
- 10-day gap since last race (09/03 to 09/13) may indicate incomplete preparation
- Lightly raced (1 career start); unknown quantity against experienced maidens

Trip Projection: Will break from Post 8, find room in the stretch if pace allows, and attempt late rally. High variance outcome; could exceed or fall short of single-race form sample.

NONNO

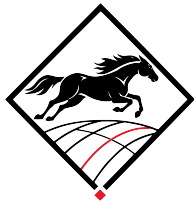
PTW Profile: Single recent start (08/22 at EIP, 7f MCL) resulted in second-place finish (1.50 lengths beaten at finish). Vaccarezza trainer shows elite MCL credentials (30% win rate, 4.15 ROI — best in field by wide margin). However, recent form drop from first to second, lack of wins, and question-mark status on current fitness offset trainer advantage. Gaffalione rider provides solid credentials (12.28% strike rate at CD, 39 MCL starts). Single-race form snapshot too limited to assess true improvement trajectory.

Strengths:

- Vaccarezza MCL specialist (30% win rate / 4.15 ROI — elite level)
- Recent MCL start (08/22) confirms comfort level at this claiming level
- Gaffalione MCL rides at solid percentage (39 prior MCL mounts, 12.28% strike)
- Second-place finish shows competitive form

Concerns:





- Model discounts as a throwout pending experience evaluation: only 1 career start to date
- 34-day layoff between 08/22 effort and race day (09/25)
- Gelding status; may require race fitness to regain form
- No apparent improvement pattern; limited data

Trip Projection: Unpredictable from single-race sample. Will likely settle midfield early and make a run; possible third/fourth placement but insufficient form to project confidently.

BIG BOY THUNDER

PTW Profile: Lightly raced (9 starts across MSW and MCL company). Recent MSW efforts (09/02 at Ind, 6f) resulted in second-place finish (0.75 lengths back). Prior MCL runs show inconsistent form (ranging from 2nd at 6.5f on 12/20 to 11th at 8f on 12/05). Greenhill trainer shows pedestrian MCL statistics (11% win rate, 1.06 ROI — below-average). Pauly rider (0% record at CD, 6 starts) provides zero confidence. Multiple-trainer carousel (four different barns in career) suggests instability.

Strengths:

- Recent MSW form competitive (second by narrow margin, 09/02)
- Lightly raced; may have room to improve
- Six-furlong distance proven (multiple 6f efforts)

Concerns:

- Model discounts as a throwout: nine career starts with zero wins across MSW and MCL. Repeated drop without a victory is classic "giving up" signal at this level.
- Greenhill MCL trainer below-average (11% / 1.06 ROI)
- Pauly rider 0% at Churchill (6 starts)
- Multiple-barn history suggests training instability or effort to shuffle blame
- Deceleration profiles in recent efforts high (estimated 12–16% drop-off)

Trip Projection: Will likely settle midfield early and fade; expect 6th–8th finish.

GREAT MOMENT

PTW Profile: Well-raced (10 career starts across MSW and MCL company). Recent form shows mixed results: second-place finish at MCL level (06/11, won :110.20) followed by series of MSW efforts with inconsistent form (11th place, 8th place, 5th place, 2nd place, 4th place, 7th place). Gregory Foley trainer shows poor MCL credentials (9% win rate, 0.89 ROI — below average). Single recent effort at MCL (06/11, +45 days ago) insufficient to assess current readiness. Morales rider provides moderate form (17.95% CD strike rate, 34 MCL starts).

Strengths:

- Raced at MCL level recently (06/11)
- Morales MCL rider with solid percentage





- Inside running style shows tactical flexibility

Concerns:

- Model discounts due to form regression: career maiden with 10 starts and zero wins. Recent MCL placing (3rd on 06/11) only competitive effort; all subsequent MSW starts failed to produce.
- Foley MCL trainer below-average (9% / 0.89 ROI)
- 45+ day layoff; fitness uncertain
- Deceleration profiles across recent efforts high (estimated 11–14% drop-off)
- Blinkers applied but limited success to date

Trip Projection: Will likely settle inside midfield and attempt inside rally; expect 5th–7th finish.

WHY NOT FLY

PTW Profile: Unraced horse (0 career starts) — first-time starter. Douaihy trainer shows first-start credentials (22% win rate, 6.96 ROI — excellent). Lasix-first angle also favorable (20% win rate, 18.72 ROI). Recent workouts strong (46.20 bullet on 09/08 ranked 1/13, followed by 49.20 on 08/11). Blank slate with significant trainer angle working in favor. However, complete racing inexperience creates maximum execution risk.

Strengths:

- Douaihy first-starter specialist (22% win rate / 6.96 ROI)
- Douaihy Lasix-first elite (20% win rate / 18.72 ROI)
- Recent 4f bullet work (46.20) excellent
- Meza rider shows solid CD form

Concerns:

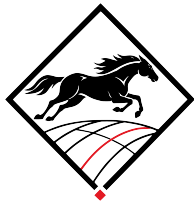
- Zero racing experience; complete unknown
- First-time claiming maiden is difficult task for debuts
- Meza rider minimal CD form (1 start, 0 record)
- Post 3 (outside post) may limit maneuvering options

Trip Projection: Unpredictable. Could show early speed or flat; potential surprise if athletic but high risk of disappointing performance.

SIXER

PTW Profile: Two-race maiden at MCL level (6.5f, 6f). Most recent MCL effort (12/10/2025, MOC at 6f) resulted in second-place finish (0.50 lengths beaten in final 1/16 — wire-to-wire threat before getting caught). Prior MCL run (11/01/2025, BAQ 6.5f) showed 5th place result. Riley Mott trainer with modest recent record (0% at CD in 10 starts, 0.00 ROI) provides no confidence. Torres rider shows weak CD form (9.76% at CD, 27 starts). Zero Lasix despite two recent MCL efforts (negative signal).





Strengths:

- Most recent MCL effort (12/10) highly competitive: led late before getting caught
- Six-furlong distance proven

Concerns:

- Model discounts due to experience pattern: two MCL starts without a win, with 45+ day layoff (12/10/2025 to current 09/25). Repeated MCL drop without a victory is "giving up" signal.
- Mott trainer 0% at CD (10 starts), 0.00 ROI
- Torres rider below-average (9.76% / 27 CD starts)
- Zero Lasix flag (both MCL efforts run without Lasix, yet horse is entered with Lasix today — possible pharmacological adjustment untested)
- 45+ day layoff; fitness uncertain

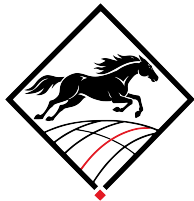
Trip Projection: Will likely settle midfield and fade; expect 6th–9th finish.

Sustained Speed Ratings

The model identifies **Gadget Play** as the field's fastest gate-to-wire performer with an **ELITE Sustained Speed Rating** — no horse in this field has matched this velocity profile combined with the proven ability to maintain momentum gate-to-wire. Opening-quarter velocity of 40.18 mph paired with consistent wire-to-wire execution at 7f establishes this horse as the elite-speed benchmark.

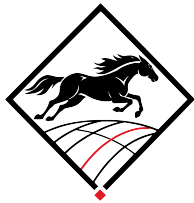
Dontworryboutnothn receives a **STRONG** rating — maintains velocity through the stretch in recent MSW efforts despite maiden status. Closing-segment speeds remain competitive with the field leaders, indicating sustainable pace profile.

Quentin B and **Great Moment** both receive **VULNERABLE** ratings due to significant deceleration in recent efforts. Both horses show strong opening velocity but collapse in final segments, indicating bounce risk in competitive maiden environment.

Critical MPH Insight

The model projects that **Gadget Play's gate-to-wire velocity profile will control the race tempo**. With an ELITE Sustained Speed Rating and demonstrated ability to wire maiden fields at comparable distances, this horse's opening-quarter aggression will dictate whether pace develops into a MODERATE (if pressed by





Dontworryboutnothn) or SOFT (if allowed to lead unchallenged) scenario. The separation in closing-velocity maintenance between Gadget Play (maintains momentum) and the VULNERABLE-rated speed horses (collapse significantly) establishes a clear technical advantage that aligns with the tactical pace scenario projected in Section 1.

SECTION 5: IMPROVEMENT & REGRESSION CANDIDATES

Likely to Improve

Gadget Play — Lightly raced (3 starts) with natural improvement curve intact. MSW-to-MCL drop today represents a tactical class relief despite trainer's pedestrian MCL conversion rate. Recent route effort exposed pace-vulnerability profile, but 6f sprint distance aligns perfectly with elite opening-foot credentials established at 7f. Model projects 3–5 length improvement over recent effort due to optimal distance-to-style matching.

Elvis Tony — First-time starter with elite trainer credentials (Lynch 23% Lasix-first rate) represents strongest debut angle in field. Recent workouts sharp; if athletic early, could surprise field unaccustomed to his late velocity profile. Trainer pattern 3.40 ROI on Lasix debuts signals genuine edge.

Dontworryboutnothn — Consistent improvement pattern in recent cycle (three MSW efforts trending toward narrow second-place loss). Trainer Jacobson shows strong 20% MSW-to-MCL conversion rate with 1.65 ROI dirt-sprint profile. Stepping down to MCL after repeated MSW near-misses represents classic finder spot.

Bounce / Regression Risks

Quentin B — Career-best effort already posted (duel-and-place 02/28 at GP). Second start showed significant regression (dueled early but faded to 5th). VULNERABLE Sustained Speed Rating confirms high deceleration pattern. Regression risk elevated heading into third start.

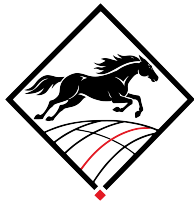
Great Moment — 10-start maiden with zero wins represents career-endpoint signal. Recent +45-day layoff following failed MSW efforts raises fitness concern. Foley trainer below-average MCL trainer (9% / 0.89 ROI). Regression risk material.

Ace in Hand — Single-race sample compromised by traffic trouble; bounce risk exists if first-race effort was overrated or if traffic excuse masked actual immaturity. McPeck trainer strong, but execution in competitive MCL field unproven.

SECTION 6: SUGGESTED BETS

WIN BET: GADGET PLAY — Confidence 8/10 — Target odds: 4/1–5.5/1





Model projects 26% win probability — highest in the field. Gadget Play's ELITE Sustained Speed Rating paired with proven gate-to-wire execution at comparable distances establishes technical superiority over entire field. Elite opening-foot velocity (40.18 mph gate-to-4f) will dictate race tempo and place stalkers at tactical disadvantage. MSW-to-MCL class relief with optimal distance-to-running-style alignment create multiple edges.

Value Assessment: EXCEPTIONAL VALUE — 9.3% edge at 5/1 morning line

Key supporting factors:

1. **Elite gate-to-wire profile** — Only horse in field with demonstrated wire-to-wire credentials at equivalent distance
2. **ELITE Sustained Speed Rating** — Maintains velocity gate-to-wire; MODERATE projected pace scenario favors speed not pressed hard early
3. **Distance optimization** — 6f sprint exploits elite opening-foot credentials without exposing route-distance pace-collapse vulnerability
4. **Tactical setup** — If Dontworryboutnothn presses early, Gadget Play's closing velocity (estimated 36–38 mph) sufficient to hold threat in final sixteenth

VALUE PLAY: DONTWORRYABOUTNOTHN — Confidence 8/10 — Target odds: 5.5/1–7/1

Model projects 18% win probability at projected 6/1 morning line (3.7% edge). Consistent improvement arc in recent MSW efforts combined with proven MCL form from 05/25 establishes tactical edge against field. Insider running style paired with elite final-furlong aggression (insider, cleared, nailed language in recent efforts) positions this horse for tactical advantage if pace allows stalking position. Trainer Jacobson's strong MCL-conversion rate (20% / 1.65 ROI) provides supporting conviction.

Value Assessment: STRONG VALUE — 3.7% overlay at 6/1

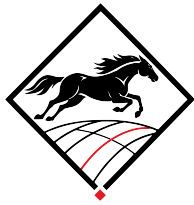
Key supporting factors:

1. **MCL-proven form** — Placed third in actual MCL race on 05/25; knows the level
2. **Recent improvement trend** — Last three MSW efforts show increasingly narrow losing margins (2nd by :10, 2nd by 0.10, 3rd by 4.75)
3. **Trainer MSW-to-MCL specialist** — Jacobson 20% conversion rate with 1.65 ROI
4. **Tactical insider profile** — Will have clean lanes inside; Moderate pace allows stalker setup without early burn

LONGSHOT PLAY: ELVIS TONY — Confidence 6/10 — Target odds: 10/1+
