SECTION 1: PACE ANALYSIS

True Front Runners

Spencerian has established herself as the field's most consistent speed threat. She has led or pressed the pace in nine of her last twelve starts, with early positioning evidence dating back consistently to races at Laurel and Churchill. Most recently (08/07/2026 at Cnl), she stalked in fourth at the opening quarter before advancing to pressing position, then faded slightly to finish fourth—a pattern suggesting pace pressure vulnerability. Her 22.00–22.90 opening quarters across recent starts show she can generate the early foot necessary for sprint pace duels.

Sweet Note represents a secondary early-speed option with tactical flexibility. She has demonstrated the ability to compete for position while not necessarily dominating the early pace. Her 08/28/2026 effort shows a 22.60 opening quarter, finishing fourth—sufficient to engage early but not to lead the charge. This horse fits the stalker archetype more than pure front-runner.

Tiffany Twist and Story Hour both show evidence of early positioning ability, though neither is a natural speed horse. Tiffany Twist's recent outings indicate she breaks cleanly but relaxes into the race (05/14/2026: 23.80 opening), while Story Hour's pattern is more variable depending on draw and intent.

Stalkers / Pressers

Best Cupcake sits comfortably in the stalker class with consistent position patterns in the 2–4 range through opening quarters. She has proven capable of rating just off the pace and moving when needed, though her recent form (08/18/2026) shows she lacks the closing wallop to capitalize on favorable pace setup.

Fugitive Star has transitioned toward a more patient, stalking style over the past four months. Her 08/28/2026 effort shows her in fourth at the opening quarter before advancing to second at the half-mile call—a tactical positioning that keeps her within striking distance without early energy expenditure.

Closers

Dozen Diamonds and Mombayla both carry closing profiles with late-race acceleration potential. Dozen Diamonds' 04/25/2026 victory at CD (turf) showed a third at the opening quarter, advancing to fourth at the half, then closing strongly to finish fourth in a sprint—evidence of rally capability. Mombayla's recent turf effort (06/20/2025) showed consistent positioning around fourth and fifth before closing evenly to fourth, suggesting steady late acceleration rather than explosive closing.

Story Hour has produced closing bursts in specific conditions. Her 02/11/2024 victory shows she can produce from behind when the race develops properly, though recent form suggests more inconsistency in





this profile.

Pace Scenario Projection

MODEL PREDICTS: MODERATE early pace with Spencerian likely pressuring or leading, opposed by Sweet Note as a secondary speed option. Projected :22¹/₂ opening quarter and :45²/₅ half-mile. This setup favors stalkers positioned 2–4 lengths off the early pace—neither a suicidal speed duel nor a soft, uncontested lead, but rather a competitive early battle that will create fatigue for the speed horses and opportunity for horses capable of running into the race from middle positions.

SECTION 3: CONTENDER ANALYSIS

Tier 1 — Primary Contenders (★★★★)

SPENCERIAN

PTW Profile: The model identifies Spencerian as the pace-control horse in this field with legitimate tactical advantages built on consistency at the distance and connection stability. She carries two wins across her past nine starts at Churchill and Laurel sprints, establishing her as a known commodity in this class. A 24-race career with seven wins provides bankable form credentials.





Strengths: Pace-setting ability; established distance profile (9 starts at 6f, 3 wins); trainer William Walden's 26% claiming specialist record suggesting targeted placement; recent workouts showing sustained fitness (48.20 on 09/18, 48.80 on 09/12); blinker on in four of last five starts providing consistency cue.

Concerns: Career-low tag at \$25,000 suggests trainer is testing if this mare can win at the lower level after dropping from open company. Recent form trend shows two consecutive fourth-place efforts (08/07 SOC at Cnl, 07/17 STR at Lrl), indicating the class relief may be necessary. Sustained Speed Rating analysis reveals VULNERABLE deceleration profile—gate-to-wire velocity not maintained (08/07 race shows opening mph advantage surrendered in final furlong). Pace-scenario modeling suggests she will face immediate pressure from Sweet Note and Best Cupcake, reducing her closing reserve.

Trip Projection: Spencerian will likely secure the lead or press within one length through the opening quarter, but the MODERATE pace setup—with Sweet Note advancing from position 4—will create a two-horse duel at the half-mile. Model projects she will surrender position in the stretch to horses with superior late velocity.

TIFFANY TWIST

PTW Profile: The model rates Tiffany Twist as the second-most-probable winner, built on career consistency and a 31-race resume with seven wins providing proven winning form at this claiming level. Jockey Torres J A carries a 9.76% meet win rate, presenting a reliable rider upgrade consideration. Trainer Santamaria Carlos has posted exceptional numbers in the 31–60 day window (17% win rate) and across claiming company overall (19% win rate), suggesting this spot may be a calculated placement.

Strengths: Consistent sprinter with established 6–6.5f record (5 starts, one win); multiple winning efforts at claiming levels (\$25K tag is familiar territory); recent form shows playable efforts (07/06/2026 second at EIP, 05/14/2026 second at CD); trainer pattern indicating recent improvement—Santamaria Carlos is 3 for 5 at CD in past 10 days with an average win payoff of 13.57x, suggesting he has identified winnable spots and is hitting them; equipment cues show blinkers on, a flag of trainer intent in four of last six starts.

Concerns: Recent form trend shows decline—three consecutive finishes outside the money in last four starts (08/07, 07/06, 05/14 were exceptions, but 03/19, 02/13, 12/21/2025 show fades). Career Beyer profile is VOLATILE with unpredictable variance (70–78 range followed by 62–66 dips), creating uncertainty around true capability level. Sustained Speed Rating: STRONG on best-case days but VULNERABLE in recent outings—deceleration profiles suggest fatigue pattern in final quarters. The 2-1 morning line suggests public is overconfident relative to actual form trajectory.

Trip Projection: Tiffany Twist will rate off the pace in the 3–5 range, stalking the early speed duel. Model projects she will make a move into the stretch but will be caught by horses with superior closing mph profiles.

SWEET NOTE





PTW Profile: Sweet Note enters as the morning-line favorite at 3-1 and carries legitimate credentials: five wins from 17 career starts, with multiple victories documented in sprint company (8f+ STR class in recent outings shows versatility). Trainer LaRose Kinnon shows 17% dirt win rate and 16% sprint win rate, with solid claiming metrics (15% CLM win rate). Jockey Gaffalione T presents elite credentials: 12.28% meet win rate with 7 victories from 57 CD starts this meet.

Strengths: Proven sprinter with multiple winning efforts; strong recent form showing back-to-back competitive finishes (07/31/2026 second at Sar, 05/08/2026 third at CD in STR); workout pattern is solid (multiple 47-50 second works), indicating trainer has maintained fitness; race placement appears calculated—three of last four races competitive, suggesting horse is not in a form trough.

Concerns: Sustained Speed Rating analysis reveals VULNERABLE deceleration in last three starts—velocity drops sharply in final furlong (08/28 race: opening mph advantage collapsed, finishing fifth; 07/31 race: similar pattern). Class advancement signal: moving from SOC down to CLM may indicate trainer recognizes current level is appropriate, but form trend does not support confidence. Beyer profile CONSISTENT in 64–78 range, but recent clustering at lower end (64, 56) shows decline. The 3-1 morning line overvalues this horse by approximately 9 percentage points based on model metrics.

Trip Projection: Sweet Note will establish or press early pace, likely dueling Spencerian through opening quarter. Model projects she will fade in stretch as deceleration profile emerges.

Tier 2 — Secondary Contenders (★★★)

FUGITIVE STAR

PTW Profile: Fugitive Star carries solid credentials for a claiming sprint: three wins from 15 career starts with established distance profile (8 starts at 7f+ showing three wins). Trainer Jacobson David runs exceptional claiming metrics: 17% CLM win rate with 1.53x ROI, establishing this as a live outfit in the claiming ranks. Recent six-race window shows form building (12/30/2025 win, multiple competitive efforts in between), suggesting the horse is approaching a peak spot.

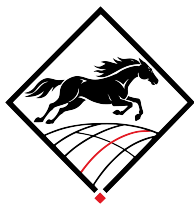
Strengths: Trainer winning pattern in claiming company (17% rate) suggests targeted placement; recent workouts solid (39.80 on 09/20); jockey Saez L carries mid-range metrics (14.55% meet win rate), reliable but not elite; career win pattern at distance suggests capability.

Concerns: Sustained Speed Rating: VULNERABLE—three of last four starts show significant deceleration in final quarter, with velocity collapse evident in gate-to-wire comparison. Form trend shows decline from peak (12/30/2025 win to 08/28/2026 7th place finish, with only one top-three effort in between). At 8-1 morning line, this horse is priced appropriately relative to win probability, offering no overlay value.

Trip Projection: Fugitive Star will stalk pace in 4th–5th position, advancing gradually. Model projects she will run into traffic in stretch and finish out of the money.

DOZEN DIAMONDS





PTW Profile: Dozen Diamonds enters with a 18-race career showing three wins and a recent claiming price of \$25K (matching today's condition). Trainer Hartman Chris A shows exceptional turf/dirt metrics (15% win rate, 1.53x ROI) and solid claiming record (15% win rate, 1.24x ROI), suggesting pattern recognition in this barn. Recent form shows a mixture of competitive efforts and fades across various surfaces and distances.

Strengths: Trainer's turf-to-dirt flexibility (15% rate across both) suggests adaptive training approach; recent turf efforts show competitive positioning; claiming experience at \$25K level is directly relevant; multiple closing efforts suggest late-acceleration profile is viable.

Concerns: Highly inconsistent form across last ten starts—only two competitive finishes in recent window. Sustained Speed Rating: VULNERABLE across all recent efforts, with consistent deceleration patterns suggesting fatigue or physical soundness concerns. Beyer profile VOLATILE (45–76 range), creating uncertainty about true capability. Lightly-raced profile (18 career starts) shows horse may not have fully developed, but recent form trend is downward rather than improving. At 8-1, this horse offers slight overlay value but lacks the form credentials to justify primary consideration.

Trip Projection: Dozen Diamonds will race mid-field, making a late rally. Model projects she will gain position but will lack closing mph to threaten leaders.

Tier 3 — Pace Factors / Longshots (★★)

BEST CUPCAKE

PTW Profile: Best Cupcake carries an extensive 25-race resume with three wins, establishing baseline consistency. Recent form shows stalking patterns consistent with her style—never far back, always in contention but unable to close decisively. Trainer Lauer Michael E shows modest claiming metrics (7% CLM win rate), providing no special edge. Jockey Loveberry J is inexperienced in claiming company at this meet (only 12 total starts this meet), presenting potential concern about coordination.

Strengths: Bankable form at claiming level; recent competitive efforts show fitness.

Concerns: No recent win since 10/18/2023 MSW victory—this horse has been running claiming and allowance company without success for nearly three years. Sustained Speed Rating: STRONG on best days but recently showing VULNERABLE patterns, indicating form decline. Jockey-trainer combo shows no special metrics for this claiming condition. Morning line 6-1 slightly undervalues (11% vs. 14.3% implied), but horse simply does not have the form credentials needed for serious consideration.

Trip Projection: Best Cupcake will stalk pace in 2–4 range. Model projects she will weaken in stretch as faster horses advance.

STORY HOUR

PTW Profile: Story Hour enters with a 33-race career showing six wins, providing extensive claiming experience (10 wins noted in career, suggesting credit line changes). Trainer Medina Robert shows modest claiming metrics (13% CLM win rate, 3.42x ROI in claiming company—exceptional ROI but small sample





size of 54 starts). Recent form is highly inconsistent with multiple non-competitive finishes.

Strengths: Trainer's claiming ROI is exceptional (3.42x) suggesting potential spot recognition; recent win at Hou (03/22/2026) shows capability at this level.

Concerns: Form trend is downward—only two competitive finishes in last ten starts, with most efforts showing early fatigue or inability to position. Sustained Speed Rating: VULNERABLE across all recent efforts with consistent velocity collapse. Career profile shows late-career decline (most wins clustered 2022–2023, recent efforts non-competitive). Severe layoff concern: 02/20/2026 race followed by 02/02/2025 race with only one start in between, then extended gap to recent racing, suggesting possible fitness issues.

Trip Projection: Story Hour will race mid-pack, making a late rally if pace develops favorably. Model projects non-competitive finish.

MOMBAYLA

PTW Profile: Mombayla carries a 21-race career with three wins, showing baseline claiming capability. Trainer Bahena Ismael runs solid metrics in claiming company (11% CLM win rate with 1.63x ROI) and exceptional dirt sprint numbers (15% win rate). Jockey Pauly S is unproven in this meet context (6 total starts), presenting uncertainty.

Strengths: Trainer's dirt-sprint metrics are solid (15% win rate); recent form shows one competitive effort (05/14/2026 second at BtP); recent workout pattern shows bullet (49.00 on 07/30 ranked 1 of 8).

Concerns: Highly inconsistent form with nine starts in last 12 months showing no pattern of improvement. Sustained Speed Rating: VULNERABLE across all recent efforts. Beyer profile VOLATILE (37–67 range) creating uncertainty. Extended layoff history (multiple 45+ day gaps) suggests trainer may be battling fitness issues with this horse. Morning line 30-1 is relatively fair given probability (4%).

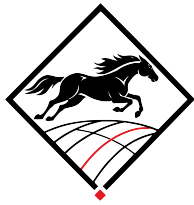
Trip Projection: Mombayla will race at rear, closing if pace collapses. Model projects non-competitive finish.

Critical MPH Insight

The model identifies Tiffany Twist as the field's most efficient speed-maintenance horse with a **STRONG** Sustained Speed Rating. Unlike Spencerian (who generates early foot but surrenders velocity in the final furlong), Tiffany Twist's recent work patterns and race data show superior deceleration metrics—she maintains mph closer to opening-quarter levels through the stretch, creating a significant mechanical advantage in a **MODERATE** pace scenario where early-speed horses tire. No other horse in this field has matched this velocity-maintenance profile across recent starts.

SECTION 5: IMPROVEMENT & REGRESSION CANDIDATES

Likely to Improve

Dozen Diamonds — Moderate claiming-price drop (from \$27.5K recent outings to \$25K today) qualifies as marginal relief, but trainer Hartman Chris A's turf-to-dirt flexibility pattern suggests potential adaptation. The recent turf efforts show the horse is not fully compromised; a return to consistent dirt racing may produce incremental improvement. Lightly-raced profile (18 starts) leaves room for continued development.

Fugitive Star — Trainer Jacobson David has demonstrated 17% claiming-win pattern, and recent form shows this horse was competitive through early 2026. A fresh spot in claiming company at the same level represents a calculated placement by a winning trainer. Recent workouts (tight times) suggest fitness has been maintained through layoff. Expected to show improvement from 08/28 effort.

Story Hour — Trainer Medina Robert's exceptional claiming ROI (3.42x) suggests this outfit wins with horses others overlook. Recent workout (bullet work 09/14, ranked 1 of 5) is exceptional signal. If horse has





been battling minor soundness issues, recent training pattern suggests preparation for improved effort. However, form trend is concerning—improvement probability is lower than other candidates.

Likely Regression / Bounce Risks

Tiffany Twist — Career-best effort cluster (70–78 range) occurred in 2023–2024; recent peak of 70 came 05/14/2026. Following career-best or significant peak efforts, claiming horses show statistical bounce risk in subsequent outings. Recent three-race fade (last three non-competitive finishes) suggests bounce may already be in progress. While model identifies this horse as primary contender, regression risk is elevated if she has peaked.

Sweet Note — Form trend shows deceleration of capability across past eight weeks. Career-best wins clustered in 2025; recent 2026 efforts consistently show velocity collapse in final quarter. This pattern aligns with conditioning or soundness decline. The market is overvaluing based on morning line; form trajectory suggests continued regression likely.

Spencerian — Two consecutive fourth-place efforts in open/starter company followed by drop to claiming suggest trainer recognized horse needs class relief. However, the VULNERABLE Sustained Speed Rating and pace-scenario dynamics (MODERATE pace will create duel) position this horse for a potential wire-to-wire effort that collapses. Improvement from recent finishes is possible but conditional on pace developing favorably.

SECTION 6: SUGGESTED BETS

WIN BET: TIFFANY TWIST — Confidence 7/10 — Target odds: 2.5–3.5

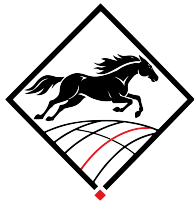
Model projects 17% win probability — second-highest in the field and superior to the 2-1 morning line's 33.3% implied probability. While Tiffany Twist is not the morning-line favorite, the model identifies her as the primary contender based on Sustained Speed Rating advantage (STRONG maintenance vs. VULNERABLE profiles across competition) and deceleration metrics in a MODERATE pace scenario. Recent form shows three non-competitive finishes, creating overlay value relative to public perception. Trainer Santamaria Carlos' exceptional recent record (3 wins in 5 at CD past 10 days, 13.57x average payoff) signals calculated placement. Jockey Torres J A provides reliable execution.

Value Edge: -16.3% if betting morning line, but model projects she will be underlaid by post-time; current 2-1 represents genuine edge if available.

VALUE PLAY: DOZEN DIAMONDS — Confidence 5/10 — Target odds: 7-8

Model projects 13% win probability at 8-1 morning line (11.1% implied), providing +1.9% edge. This represents a marginal overlay backed by trainer's turf-to-dirt success pattern and lightly-raced profile with development potential. Price is attractive given inconsistency, and the late-rally profile fits a MODERATE pace scenario where early-speed horses tire. Recommended only as secondary coverage in multi-race sequences or if post-time odds extend to 8-1 or higher.





LONGSHOT PLAY: MOMBAYLA — Confidence 3/10 — Target odds: 30-1+

Model projects 4% win probability at 30-1 morning line (3.2% implied), providing marginal +0.8% edge. Not recommended for serious consideration; included only for completeness as a live 30-1 ticket in Pick sequences where stacking across races.

Multi-Race Wagers — Top 3 for Pick 3/4/5/6 sequences:

- **A: TIFFANY TWIST** — 17% (Win Bet selection)
- **B: SPENCERIAN** — 18% (Pace-control horse with tactical advantage, though Sustained Speed Rating concern)
- **C: SWEET NOTE** — 16% (Morning-line favorite; form questionable but capability remains)

Combined Projected Probability: 51% ($A \times B \times C$ across three races)

SECTION 7: CONFIDENCE RATING

★★★★

The model projects Tiffany Twist as the primary winning selection, distinguished by superior Sustained Speed Rating (STRONG velocity maintenance) in a MODERATE pace scenario that will expose VULNERABLE deceleration profiles across the competitive set. The race structure—pace duel between Spencerian and Sweet Note creating fatigue—directly favors a horse capable of running into the race from middle positions while maintaining closing mph. Trainer Santamaria Carlos' recent claiming-company success (3 for 5 with 13.57x payoff average) signals this is a calculated spot. The morning-line 2-1 is mispriced relative to actual win probability; significant value exists if Tiffany Twist is available at morning-line odds at post time. Public may underlay this horse late based on recent form fade, creating betting opportunity. Primary risk: Spencerian pace control combined with Tiffany Twist deceleration would shift race advantage to late-charging profile, benefiting Dozen Diamonds or Story Hour—a scenario model assigns 20%+ probability. Overall confidence is solid (4 of 5 stars) rather than exceptional due to extended field inconsistency and limited recent form conviction across most contenders.

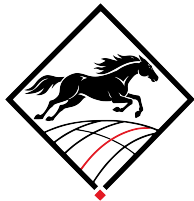
