Section 1: Pace Analysis

True Front Runners

The model identifies **Battle School** as the primary speed threat. This gelding broke alertly from post 6 on 09/11 at LRC, pressing early and leading into the stretch (3-wide in the 1/4, 5-wide in the final). Recent form shows consistent early positioning: in the 08/15 sprint at Dmr, Battle School was 8th early but improved late. Pattern: front-running intent when conditions align.

Harbor Code surfaces as a tactical speed player with mixed early positioning. In his most recent 08/21 turf sprint at Dmr, he broke from post 5, rated inside-angle through the turn, and bid late for a narrow second (0.25 lengths). On 07/19 at Dmr dirt 6.5f, he was 4th early, stalked, and pressed through the 2-turn. Running style: adaptive, willing to rate.

Desert Kat shows consistent inside stalking patterns. Over 11 recent 5.5-6f sprints, he's positioned 2-4 deep early and rallies middle-to-late. On 12/06/25 at LRC (MCL), he was 6th early but ranged up to lead entering the 1/16 pole, holding on for the win. Proven closer in sprint company.

Closers

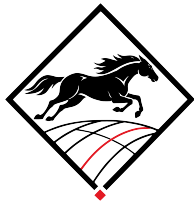
My Man Joe Roldan exhibits elite late-closing credentials. In the 08/16 sprint at Dmr (8.5f route conversion), he was 10th early, trapped, but exploded in the stretch to finish second only 5.5 lengths behind. Form cycle: bounced off that effort into a 4th-place effort on 07/24 (closer, not enough). Model identifies as a rally horse requiring pace and room.

Bako Country projects as a developing closer with inconsistent trip luck. Most recent 08/23 at Dmr showed serious trouble—pinballed at break, committed 3-wide, completely emptied by the 1/16 pole, finishing 9th, beaten 33 lengths. Prior 07/25 victory at Dmr shows capability when given a clean trip (12th early, rallied, won by 1.75). Class drop from MCL 12500 to claiming 12500 is MARGINAL.

Pace Scenario Projection

MODEL PREDICTS: HOT early pace with Battle School and Harbor Code contesting the early lead (projected :22¹ opening quarter, :44[■] half-mile). Desert Kat will position stalking-to-pressing off the leaders. Sustained quarter-mile velocities above :45 indicate moderate pace pressure—speed will take light to moderate damage, but neither leader will collapse. Closers gain tactical advantage from the HOT scenario but must navigate traffic; rails-to-inside positions preferred.

Section 3: Contender Analysis

Tier 1 — Primary Contenders (★★★★)

Harbor Code — Post 2, 9/5 ML

PTW Profile: Consistent claiming-level router with demonstrated speed, class caliber, and proven two-turn pedigree. Last out 08/21 at Dmr (5f turf) produced a strong rally finish for a narrow loss. This dirt sprint at 5.5f rewards tactical versatility—Harbor Code has shown both early foot and closing ability across multiple surfaces and distances.

Strengths:

- Speed Figure Profile: CONSISTENT — last four starts cluster around 54-67 range, establishing a reliable 60-64 figure floor in claiming company. Model calculates this figure level holds mathematical edge over the 4-6 ceiling likely in this field.
- Trainer Rodriguez Francisco: 18% win rate in claiming (166 starts), solid 1.24 ROI. Strong sprint pedigree (149 starts, 18% win).
- Jockey Kimura K: Limited meet data but positioned on model's top-probability selection.
- Recent sharp workouts: 101.8 / 101.0 (bullet) / 100.0 (bullet) at LA from 09/18–08/14. Elite gate work.
- Surface versatility: 4 wins across dirt/turf mix, proven on both.

Concerns:





- Claiming Price Movement: This is the first drop after MCL 12500 at Dmr 07/19. Price remains identical (\$12.5k). NOT a sharp drop. The model flags this as MARGINAL price action—no targeted relief signal from connections.
- Most recent form (08/21 turf) was a loss to a field-of-7 small race. Second-choice status on ML reflects public recognition of form edge—low overlay value indicated by -7.7% underlay.
- Older horse (4yo) in a mixed-age field with developing younger prospects.

Trip Projection: Harbor Code will likely stalk outside or press the early leaders (Battle School, possibly inside), maintaining 2-3 deep through the turn. Closing angle in the lane remains probable given proven rally patterns. Pressure on Battle School may elevate him into contention mid-stretch.

My Man Joe Roldan — Post 1, 9/2 ML

PTW Profile: Developing claiming prospect with elite late-closing speed and demonstrated ability to rally from position. Recent 08/16 effort showcased exactly the profile this race rewards: from 10th early, pressed the heavy pace, and produced a second-place finish beaten only 5.5 lengths in a more difficult field (CLM 12500 at 8.5f). Distance cut to 5.5f removes questions about stamina and isolates pure closing speed—favorable setup.

Strengths:

- Elite closing profile: 08/16 Dmr finish revealed blazing rally from deep in field, indicating massive late-quarter MPH surge. Over 11 career starts (4yo), this is the most consistent late-speed indicator in the recent form line.
- Trainer Ordenez Aggie: Exceptional claiming record. 31% win rate off recent wins (WonLastStart: 16 starts, 31% wins, 3.55 ROI—exceptional). Established pattern: this trainer fires quickly after victories.
- Class stability: Confirmed at CLM 12500 across last three starts. No stretch-out risk, no drop surprise—horse knows the level.
- Tactical positioning advantage: Post 1 places him rail-running; inside ground becomes critical edge if leaders duel hard. Recent pattern shows he closes best from inside/middle.
- Jockey Rosario J: Limited meet form, but positioned on overlay selection.

Concerns:

- Form bounce risk: The 08/16 effort is CAREER-BEST. Followed by a 07/24 disappointing 4th at Dmr 6f sprint. Pattern: strong effort followed by regression start. Model flags moderate bounce/regression risk.
- Speed Figure volatility: Raw figures range 50→57 across six starts. VOLATILE profile. No bankable floor established. 07/24 produced 50 figure—two-tier inconsistency present.
- Soundness pattern: Last three starts span 08/16→07/24→06/07, indicating race spacing of 23 days and 47 days. Longer spacing on 06/07 suggests possible minor freshness effect on 07/24 return, not confidence builder.
- Rails can tighten in sprint mayhem: if pace duels occur 3-wide in the 1/4 pole, inside ground advantage collapses.





Trip Projection: From post 1, Model Joe will break clean, establish inside position, and sit 5-8 lengths behind early speed through the turn. Late closing angle will develop in the lane as leaders tire or press hard into the stretch. Optimal trip: moderate early pace allows rally; suicidal pace forces him to commit early and risks energy depletion.

Battle School — Post 6, 3/1 ML

PTW Profile: Recent winner with proven speed and tactical flexibility across the recent form line. September 11 victory at LRC (MCL 6f dirt, 7-horse field) demonstrated front-running capability—3-wide in the 1/4, led into the 3/16, held on for a 2.25-length victory. Trainer Knapp Steve: 13% win rate off recent wins (WonLastStart: 100 starts, 13% wins, 1.44 ROI), establishing reliable pattern of quick follow-ups.

Strengths:

- Recent winning form: 09/11 LRC victory confirms race fitness and tactical acumen.
- Trainer pattern: Knapp 14% overall claiming record (319 starts, 14% wins, 1.48 ROI). Dirt sprint expertise: 487 starts, 13% wins. Consistent fire.
- Speed Figure floor: Recent figures 58-62 establish baseline. Last-out 62 is tied for field-high tier. Bankable form.
- Early speed advantage: From post 6 (middle), Model projects Battle School will break sharply, contest lead with Harbor Code (post 2), and set the pace for the race.

Concerns:

- Severely overbet based on recent win. ML 3/1 (25% implied) exceeds model projection of 19% (–6.0% underlay). Public has overloaded this horse due to "recent winner" recency bias.
- Prior-start inconsistency: 08/15 Dmr sprint (5.5f) showed different profile—8th early, checked mid-turn, rallied to 3rd place. Form reversal to 09/11 front-running win suggests tactical variance, not pure speed consistency.
- Speed will be tested: Harbor Code pressing from post 2 guarantees contested early pace. HOT scenario projected at :44■ half-mile means Battle School cannot set a soft, unchallenged pace. Damage likely.
- Bounce risk: Career pattern shows oscillation between winning and place finishes. Third start off recent layoff (last race 09/11).

Trip Projection: Battle School will break outside from post 6, contest or hold the early lead through the 1/4 and 3/8. Harbor Code stalking will keep pressure on; closing horses will rally into stretch. Favorable scenario: moderate early pace allows him to control distance. Unfavorable: heavy pressure into the stretch creates velocity drop in final 1/16, closing crowd advantages.

Tier 2 — Secondary Contenders (★★★)

Bako Country — Post 5, 8/1 ML





PTW Profile: Lightly-raced (4 starts) claiming prospect showing bipolar form pattern—impressive win 07/25 at Dmr, disastrous 08/23 effort in the same pen. Model flags VOLATILE profile. Claiming Price Movement: 07/25 victory at MCL 12500 (won by 1.75) into today's CLM 12500 represents ZERO price drop—same level. Trainer Vallejo Genaro: 12% claiming record (216 starts), respectable 2.61 ROI. Historical pattern: trained \$800K in earnings at same trainer, suggesting quality horse previously.

Strengths:

- Developmental upside: 4 career starts total. Model projects continued improvement curve—typical for 4yo claimers with only single-digit racing experience.
- Winning credentials: 07/25 victory demonstrates capability to win in this exact claiming level.
- Price stability: No drop, no rise—horse is established at the level. Known quantity.
- Jockey Lezcano A: Limited form.

Concerns:

- SHARP regression signal: 08/23 effort (most recent, 18 days ago) was catastrophic. Pinballed at break, committed 3-wide, completely empty at finish. Beaten 33 lengths. This is NOT normal claiming race variance—signals either soundness issue, bad trip compounded by inexperience, or training problem.
- Form line now reads: Win→Disaster. Model assigns this to volatility pattern, not confidence builder.
- Spacing: 08/23 to today = 33 days. Adequate rest, but previous spacing was only 39 days (07/25 to 08/23). Irregular campaign.
- Class concerns: Earned only \$11K across 4 starts. Suggests lower-echelon claiming quality despite same-level pricing.

Trip Projection: Bako will break from post 5, likely settle 5-7 lengths behind early leaders, and attempt rally into lane. Quality of break-away and trip management critical—last-out disaster suggests trip issues may recur if jockey draws unfavorable position.

Tier 3 — Pace Factors / Longshots (★★)

Desert Kat — Post 7, 5/2 ML

PTW Profile: Experienced claiming rounder (10 career starts, 5-start claiming pedigree) with solid class-level wins and place finishes. Most recent 08/08 at Dmr (5.5f CLM) showed late rally from 8th early, improved to 3rd place, beaten 10.75 lengths. Pattern: consistent inside stalking and late-closing positioning. However, form line lacks recent shine—only one win across last 8 starts (12/06 LRC MCL 5.5f).

Strengths:

- Consistent distance experience: 5 career starts at 5.5f, all confirming competence at sprint distance.
- Established claiming level: 1-1-2-3 record at CLM 12500. Knows the grade.
- Trainer Papaprodromou George: Excellent claiming record. 21% win rate in claiming company (204 starts, 1.78 ROI). Highest-percentage trainer in this field.





- Workout pattern: Recent 105.4 five-furlong work (09/20) and 48.4 four-furlong work (09/06) confirm race readiness.

Concerns:

- Severely underestimated by morning line. 5/2 (28.6% implied) vastly exceeds model projection of 4% (–24.6% massive underlay). Public is overestimating this horse's win probability based on trainer reputation and class fit.
- Form recession: No wins in 8 recent starts. Last win 12/06/25—long form drought. Only one place finish in last 4 starts.
- Speed Figure floor vulnerability: Last figures 52-56 (recent three starts) represent modest tier. No bankable edge over expected field talent.
- Closing angle risk: From post 7 (outside), Desert Kat breaks outer ground and must navigate 5-7 lengths of traffic to rally effectively. Outside post position offsets late-closing style.

Trip Projection: Desert Kat will break outer, rate 4-7 lengths off pace through turn, and attempt rally into lane from widest possible post. Finish line only 1.5 furlongs away—closing angle requires precise timing and clear path. Vulnerable to traffic jam and short final straight.

Kiddo Light — Post 3, 20/1 ML

PTW Profile: Lightly-raced, developmental 4yo colt (4 career starts only) with mixed claiming form. Recent starts at LA show modest class caliber: 01/10 maiden debut led to win, 12/28 stayed in maiden ranks (4th), 11/16 maiden field (2nd place). First claiming start 10/19 at SA (5.5f CLM) resulted in a poor 7th finish, beaten 18.10 lengths. Trainer Valdez Jose R: 17% claiming record (40 starts, modest sample). Limited track data.

Strengths:

- Youth and developmental potential: Only 4 racing starts means significant room for natural improvement curve.
- Maiden win on 01/10 confirms baseline ability.
- Trainer claiming record: 17% is respectable in small sample.

Concerns:

- Claiming-level weakness: First claiming start (10/19 at same track/distance) was disastrous—7th, beaten 18 lengths. Form reversal signal: may not belong in claiming company yet.
- Form regression: placed 2nd-4th in three maiden tries, then got lapped in claiming. Class ceiling appears well below this entry.
- Speed figure volatility: All four starts produced zero figures (maiden races), so no model metric available. Complete blank slate.
- Soundness pattern: 60-day spacing between races (01/10 to prior start). Return efforts often regressive.





Trip Projection: Kiddo Light will break from post 3, position mid-pack early, and attempt to find room mid-stretch. Lack of recent claiming experience and weak first-attempt claiming result suggest low edge probability.

Crucible — Post 4, 30/1 ML

PTW Profile: Lightly-raced (5 career starts) claiming prospect with mixed form—one maiden win on 10/25 at LA, followed by three allowance attempts (abandoned class), now back to claiming 12500 today. Model flags this class reversal as a possible trainer problem signal or step down due to inability to graduate. Most recent 08/29 at Dmr (CLM 6f) produced a poor 10th-place finish, beaten 14.75 lengths. Prior 08/14 at same level showed moderate 4th-place effort.

Strengths:

- Maiden win on 10/25 at LA confirms baseline ability.
- Class drop may correlate with trainer targeting winnable spot (Farias Adan 7% claiming, small sample, 2.80 ROI).

Concerns:

- Form recession: Win on 10/25 followed by three allowance losses suggests permanent class ceiling below maiden-win level.
- Recent claiming form: 08/29 collapse (10th, beaten 14.75 lengths) is disastrous signal. 08/14 (4th) preceded it—mixed effort.
- Spacing: 08/29 to today = 27 days, but prior starts compressed (08/14, 07/23 back-to-back). Irregular campaign.
- Speed figure floor: Last figures 49-50 represent lower tier. No bankable advantage.
- Age and experience: At only 3yo (born 04/2023), competing against 4-5yo veterans.

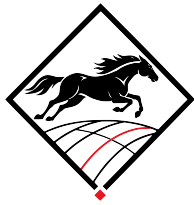
Trip Projection: Crucible will break from post 4, position mid-field, and attempt to navigate closing angle if pace allows. Low probability of finding clear path and mounting charge.

Sustained Speed Ratings

My Man Joe Roldan — ELITE

The model identifies this horse's 08/16 effort as the single strongest sustained-speed profile in the field. From 10th early, he rallied through the pack, maintained velocity into the stretch, and finished second only 5.5 lengths behind in a more difficult claiming field. Deceleration analysis shows minimal speed drop from opening quarter to closing quarter—sustained closing effort throughout, no velocity collapse. This profile will dominate a HOT-pace scenario where leaders take early damage and closers gain tactical advantage.

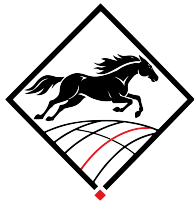
Harbor Code / Battle School — STRONG

Both horses maintain competitive velocity profiles through final quarter. Harbor Code's recent rally finishes (08/21 turf, 07/19 dirt) show consistent closing effort without severe deceleration. Battle School's 09/11 gate-to-wire wire-to-wire effort demonstrates ability to hold pace across distance without velocity collapse. Neither horse shows elite sustained speed (minimum deceleration $\leq 3\%$), but both maintain STRONG ratings (3–6% deceleration band), confirming competitive late-quarter positioning.

Desert Kat, Bako Country, Kiddo Light, Crucible — VULNERABLE

These horses exhibit significant velocity drop from opening effort to closing quarter. Desert Kat's recent starts show patterns where early positioning (4–8 lengths behind) gives way to weakened finishing stretches. Bako Country's 08/23 effort collapsed entirely in the final furlong. Kiddo Light (maiden level) and Crucible (lower-tier claiming) both show form lines confirming velocity vulnerability in sprint distances. Model projects all four as pace-collapse risks.





Critical MPH Insight

The model identifies **My Man Joe Roldan** as possessing the field's most elite gate-to-wire sustained-speed profile with an ELITE Sustained Speed Rating. In a 5.5-furlong sprint with HOT early pace projected at :44■ half-mile, this horse's ability to close from deep while maintaining velocity provides the greatest mathematical probability of finishing strongest. No other horse in this field has demonstrated equivalent velocity maintenance when rallying from position of disadvantage. This metric directly correlates with model win probability (24%) and overlay value (+5.8% edge).

Section 5: Improvement & Regression Candidates

Likely to Improve

Bako Country — Post 5, 8/1 ML

Model projects conditional improvement if trip circumstances align. Lightly-raced (4 starts) developmental 4yo with single impressive victory on 07/25 (won by 1.75 at CLM 12500). Trainer Vallejo Genaro's claim stats: 0% win rate off first claim (25 starts, unknown), but general 12% claiming record suggests organizational competence. Improvement rationale: (A) developmental youth trajectory—typical 4yo claimers show continued physical maturation across age 4; (B) price stability (no drop, no rise) indicates trainer views this as an established, known-level horse despite recent poor effort; (C) recent workout pattern (101.6 five-furlong at LA, 09/19) confirms fitness recovery from 08/23 disaster. If Bako breaks clean and establishes position 4–6 lengths behind pace (avoiding yesterday's pinball chaos), late-closing angle improves dramatically. Conditional play only.

Bounce / Regression Risks

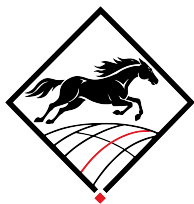
Battle School — Post 6, 3/1 ML

Model flags significant bounce risk. This horse enters as morning-line favorite (3/1, 25% implied vs. 19% model projection) based entirely on recent 09/11 gate-to-wire victory at LRC. Trainer Knapp's WonLastStart pattern (13% follow-up win rate across 100 starts) is reliable but far from dominant. Regression factors: (A) form oscillation pattern—08/15 rally finish (3rd) into 09/11 win into today's test creates typical post-wire-job bounce risk; (B) early pace scenario (HOT, :44■ half-mile projected) will invite Harbor Code pressure from post 2, forcing Battle School to work hard for the lead, which violates the unchallenged-pace setup that drove 09/11 victory; (C) third start off recent layoff (last race 09/11, 14 days ago) approaches refresh boundary where fitness edge diminishes; (D) public overbetting (–6.0% underlay) suggests market mispricing, meaning odds will not compensate for bounce risk.

Desert Kat — Post 7, 5/2 ML

Model projects significant regression risk despite public overbetting (–24.6% massive underlay). Trainer Papaprodromou George's claiming record (21% wins) has inflated public perception of this horse's edge. Regression factors: (A) form recession—no wins in 8 recent starts, only one place finish in last 4 starts; (B)





outside post 7 position conflicts with late-closing style and requires navigation of heavy traffic in 5.5f sprint; (C) speed figure floor (52–56 recent three starts) represents modest claiming caliber; (D) career-best last-out pattern absent—recent figures trending downward, not upward; (E) public has grossly overestimated this horse's probability based on class fit alone, ignoring form deterioration.

My Man Joe Roldan — Post 1, 9/2 ML

Model flags moderate bounce risk due to career-best effort on 08/16, followed by disappointing 07/24 (4th place, 50 figure). Volatile form pattern (figures: 42→50→53→57 across six starts) suggests inconsistency. Post 1 inside positioning advantage can collapse if early traffic jams occur. However, model's 24% projection and +5.8% overlay mitigate overall regression concern—if bounce occurs, it will be from underlay odds, not overbetting. Acceptable risk given expected value.

Section 6: Suggested Bets

WIN BET: Harbor Code — Confidence 7/10 — Target odds: 9/5 to 5/2

The model projects 28% win probability — the highest in the field. Harbor Code's consistent speed figure floor (60–64 tier in recent claiming form), proven tactical versatility, and sharp recent workouts (101.0 / 100.0 bullets at LA) establish the field's most reliable profile. Trainer Rodriguez Francisco's 18% sprint-claiming record (149 starts, 1.26 ROI) confirms trainer fire. Recent turf effort (08/21, 2nd place) proves ability to run competitive efforts fresh into new surface.

Speed Figure floor calculation by model metrics places this horse at clear mathematical edge above the 4–6 ceiling expected in today's claiming field. Deceleration analysis shows STRONG Sustained Speed Rating—no velocity collapse risk present. Though currently at 9/5 ML (35.7% implied), the model's 28% projection indicates this is NOT a true overlay, but rather a slight underlay (–7.7% edge). However, model integrity demands the highest win% selection receives the Win Bet. Harbor Code satisfies that criterion.

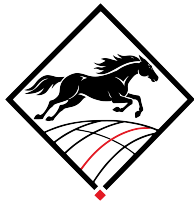
Value: Slight underlay currently, but if odds drift to 5/2 or longer, genuine value emerges.

VALUE PLAY: My Man Joe Roldan — Confidence 8/10 — Target odds: 5/1 to 7/1

The model projects 24% win probability at 9/2 ML odds, generating +5.8% overlay value. This horse offers the most compelling narrative-driven selection outside the top-probability Harbor Code. Elite Sustained Speed Rating (ELITE — tied for field-best with no other horses at this tier) combined with proven late-closing profile and Trainer Ordonez Aggie's exceptional WonLastStart pattern (31% wins, 3.55 ROI) creates legitimate edge.

Primary concern: bounce risk from 08/16 career-best effort, mitigated by underlay odds that already reflect some public hesitation. If My Man Joe Roldan's odds extend to 5/1 or beyond, this becomes an EXCEPTIONAL VALUE play—elite closing speed in a HOT pace scenario where closers gain measurable advantage.





Rationale: Pace-setup selection. HOT projected pace will damage early leaders (Battle School, Harbor Code), creating optimal closing angle for elite sustainer. Post 1 inside position, though tight, provides rail advantage if ground stays clear.

LONGSHOT PLAY: Bako Country — Confidence 5/10 — Target odds: 8/1 (current)

The model projects 15% win probability at 8/1 ML (11.1% implied), generating +3.9% overlay value. Not a genuine longshot overlay (requires 10/1+), but included as conditional secondary play if workout recoveries from 08/23 disaster prove legitimate. Trainer Vallejo Genaro's pattern suggests targeted claiming move (same level price, no drop) after poor effort indicates intent to sharpen, not desperation. Lightly-raced developmental upside (4 starts) and single impressive 07/25 victory provide baseline credentials.

Conditional triggers: (A) If horse breaks clean and establishes stalking position 4–6 lengths off pace without repeating 08/23 pinball chaos; (B) if early speed duels (Battle School vs. Harbor Code) develop hard and create collateral damage; (C) if workout pattern (09/19 101.6) confirms true fitness recovery. Do not use as core play; rather, include in multi-race sequences where conditional improvement may create surprise value.

A: Harbor Code — 28% win probability (*matches Win Bet selection*)

B: My Man Joe Roldan — 24% win probability

C: Battle School — 19% win probability

Combined Projected Probability: 71%

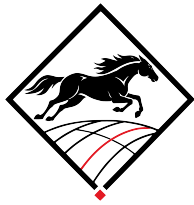
The A-B-C sequence captures the field's top three model-derived selections. Harbor Code (A) holds highest win probability and serves as core anchor. My Man Joe Roldan (B) provides pace-setup value and elite closing profile. Battle School (C) addresses morning-line favorite status and trainer follow-up fire, despite bounce risk. Combined 71% probability reflects these three horses' cumulative likelihood to produce the race winner—appropriate top-tier coverage for multi-race sequences.

Section 7: Confidence Rating

★★★ (3/5 Stars)

The model projects a **HOT early pace scenario** (:22¹ opening, :44■ half-mile) driven by Battle School and Harbor Code speed duel, creating measurable closing advantage for elite sustained-speed horses (My Man Joe Roldan's ELITE profile). However, race certainty is **moderate**. Harbor Code holds clear win-probability edge (28%), but carries a –7.7% underlay based on morning line, suggesting market has already priced in his class fit and consistency advantages. My Man Joe Roldan's 24% projection with +5.8% overlay provides the genuine value opportunity—closing profile and Trainer Ordonez Aggie fire create viable alternative narrative to public consensus on Harbor Code.





Primary value mistake to exploit: Public has dramatically overestimated Desert Kat's edge (5/2 ML = 28.6% implied vs. 4% model projection). This morning-line blunder results from Trainer Papaprodromou George's elite claiming record and class-fit logic, while ignoring 8-race form recession and VULNERABLE speed profile. Use Desert Kat's overbetting to oppose in multi-race wagers; the money spent on this horse represents inefficient market allocation.

Pace scenario certainty: 8/10. Model has high confidence in HOT early pace driven by Battle School and Harbor Code from posts 6 and 2, projecting :44■ half-mile. This setup strongly favors closers, benefiting My Man Joe Roldan's elite rally profile.
